1943: U.K. Headstone of F.C. (Fred) Schultz, FTGCC pre WW2 Secretary, Treasurer & World War II casualty who was Killed in Action – 11/6/1943

1948: The first F.T.G.D.C.A. Premiership Pennant, won by the FTGCC when we defeated The Basin #1 Team. We scored 204 with the stars Jim Bradley 94*, Bob DeCoite 47 & Bill Dinsdale 27. In reply The Basin were dismissed for 89 (Alan Barber 5/9, Roy Sidebottom 2/19) & 72 (Snowy Hicks 2/14, Alan Barber 2/19) with Roy Dinsdale involved in 6 dismissals. We won the first F.T.G.D.C.A. Premiership by an Innings & 43 Runs.

1955: The 1954/55 C Grade (2nd XI) Premiership Pennant, which was won without a Ball being bowled, when it was discovered by the FTGDCA that both opponents in the other Semi Final has played ineligible players and were disqualified from the Grand Final – we won our Semi and the Premiership!
