The stars were the skipper Barry with 84, Dave McIntyre 83\* & 5/79 from 23 (8 Ball) Overs in a match winning performance, Ian Ewart 67 & Doug McMillan 50. In reply they were dismissed for 201 with Dave well supported by Gary Evans 4/26.


**1969:** The City of Knox "Proclamation Trophy", Perpetually awarded to winners of the President's Award since 1969/70






