FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB WAR SERVICE HONOUR ROLL & K.I.A. PLAQUE

The following images are of the Club's War Service Honour Roll, dedicated in 2012 and a later plaque installed in 2016. The Honour Roll records all known members of the FTGCC and FTGFC who gave of themselves in serving their country in the conflicts associated with World War I and World War II. The Plaque, now mounted at the Reserve on the terraces outside the #1 Oval playing field, commemorates the seven men who paid the ultimate sacrifice for their Country and Club during these two conflicts.



These two images depict the War Service Honour Roll of the Ferntree Gully Cricket Club and the Ferntree Gully Football Club (unveiled 2012) and a dedication plaque (unveiled in 2016) commemorating the club's losses in World War I & World War II. The Honour Roll hangs proudly in the "Walter H. Tew Pavilion" as a permanent reminder to members of both Clubs, that their freedom and quality of life was fought for in the world's great 20th century conflicts.

The Plaque commemorates the seven men who paid the ultimate sacrifice during these two conflicts and is now a permanent fixture adjacent to the players entrance of the #1 Oval of the "Wally Tew Reserve."
