# Newspaper Notes

**18/10/1907** **BHR** **FERNTREE GULLY ECHOES:** The third eleven of the EAST MELBOURNE CRICKET CLUB visited Ferntree Gully on Saturday last and met the locals. The visitors were unexpectedly beaten by the locals by 1 wicket and 1 run ensuring an exciting finish to the game. Scores for FERNTREE GULLY IMPERIALS were 9/70 against the visitors 69. McMahon played well for the victors with 38 and he also took 5/21, while Cox took 3/36. FERNTREE GULLY has started the season well winning two of three matches played. The leading scorers in these matches have been F. Carrington 12 & 38\*, Cox 11 Ret. & 17, A. Pickett 15, H. Pickett 11, E. Clohesy 13 while McMahon, Kehoe, Cox, A. Pickett and Carrington have taken the wickets.

**25/10/1907** **BHR** **FERNTREE GULLY ECHOES:** The BELGRAVE CRICKET CLUB visited FERNTREE GULLY on Saturday and suffered a rather severe defeat. Of the BELGRAVE score of 59, Lloyd batted well for 23, R. Biffen 17, L.G. Knight 11. The home team scored 155 for 7 wickets. McMahon played a dashing innings for 98 before being bowled by Giffen; F. Carrington 33, and H. Pickett 13 were next best. Among the bowlers McMahon took 8 wickets for 23 runs and Cox 2 for 6.

MELBOURNE TRADES made 96 runs to the locals 99. Scorers included A. Pickett 37, H. Monk 9, F. Carrington 14, W. Cox 13, and A.J. (Alexander Joseph) Charman 13\*, while with the ball Fred Carrington was the star taking 8/38, while J. Kehoe took his 2 wickets for 25. **2/11/1907** **PTEL** On Tuesday next (Cup Day) a combined ST. MATTHEW'S team will journey to Fern Tree Gully and play the local team. All members are to meet at Mr. W. Davies', Chapel-street, at 7.30 am.

**7/11/1907** **DA** The BELGRAVE CRICKET CLUB journeyed to Ferntree Gully on Saturday October 19<sup>th</sup> to play the IMPERIALS: Scores BELGRAVE 59, IMPERIALS 7/155. For the IMPERIALS McMahon played a splendid innings of 98 before he was disposed of, Carrington 33, H. Pickett 13 and Cox 5 Not out were the principal scorers. McMahon also dominated with the ball taking 8/23 while Cox had 2/6.

**8/11/1907** **BHR** The FERNTREE GULLY IMPERIAL club visited BELGRAVE last Saturday to play the return match with that club, which ended in a win for the home team by 23 runs. Scores: - BELGRAVE 94, IMPERIALS 71. Lloyd and Ellitson batted well for the winners, making 31 and 17, while for the losers M. Clohesy 20 and H. Pickett 11 were the best. Bowling - Clohesy 2 for 11, and Carrington 3 for 11, were the most successful for the IMPERIALS; Lloyd was the best for the winners.

**14/11/1907** **DA** As per report below

**15/11/1907** **BHR** The ST. MATTHEWS CRICKET CLUB visited Ferntree Gully on Cup Day and spent the afternoon in a game of cricket with the IMPERIALS which ended in a victory for the locals by 4 wickets and 9 runs. Scores were IMPERIALS 125 to ST. MATTHEWS 116. Best with the bat for the IMPERIALS were Carrington 16, H. Pickett 17, W. Cox 24 and Perkins 43\* whilst with the ball Cox with 6 wickets for 28 was the best. The PRAHRAN TRADES CRICKET CLUB visited Ferntree Gully by drag on the Kings Birthday.

This was the fifth occasion of a match between these two combatants, and with each having won two games apiece, some excitement was shown, and a very enjoyable game was had by all, resulting in a victory for the visitors by 7 runs. Scores were TRADES 111 to FERNTREE GULLY 104, with McMahon 15, Foster 15, W. Town 21 ret. and A. Pickett 20 ret.; bowling honours being shared around.

The Partnership between Carrington and Cox realised 102\* for the 5<sup>th</sup> Wicket.

**28/11/1907** **DA** As per report below

**29/11/1907** **BHR** YENCKEN'S CRICKET CLUB played a match against FERNTREE GULLY IMPERIALS on the ground of the latter on the 23<sup>rd</sup> inst. resulting in a victory for the visitors by 5 wickets and 35 runs. Scores were YENCKEN'S 5/119 to IMPERIALS 84 whose best were Cox 31, Carrington 14, Foster 10 and Kehoe 13 while with the ball Pickett 2/13, Stevens 1/38 and Cox 1/12 were the best.

**29/11/1907** **HER** E.L. YENCKEN and Co.'s team defeated FERNTREE GULLY last Saturday by 31 runs on the first Innings. The best efforts by the victors were made by Watson 20 and 4 for 42, Buck 25, Vollugi 27, and Hollings 5 for 20.

Best scores were achieved by Carrington 17, Town 23\* and Lavery 25\*. On Dec 14<sup>th</sup> inst. the NEW YORK CRICKET CLUB played the FERNTREE GULLY IMPERIALS at the ground of the latter, near the Club Hotel. A Victory for the locals by a slender margin was the result with NEW YORK 6/88 against FERNTREE GULLY 6/91. The best for the locals were Carrington 36, Cox 43\* and 4/14.

Refreshments will be provided for the visitors during the afternoon, and in the evening, they will be entertained at tea at the Prahran Coffee Palace.

**3/4/1908**            **BHR**        In our last Report of the progress of the creation of a RECREATION RESERVE at Ferntree Gully it almost appeared to read that Cr. Dobson moved the resolution to again write to Mr. Keast in reference to the grant for the ground. It was Cr. Selman who actually moved the resolution and who took so much interest in the purchase of the ground originally, and it was well indeed that the offer to lease the land was not accepted, as Mr. Reid on Monday incidentally dealt with the matter and went over to look at the ground. He even went so far as to promise to bring the matter before the minister to try to get a grant this year, if only a small one, so that something maybe done to the ground. The Surveyor- General pointed out that the department fully appreciated the sacrifice made by the ratepayers in paying £130 for the ground, and the Government intended to help them, but unfortunately most of the parks and gardens expense was already allocated.

Keast, stating that the lands department has allotted a grant of £50 for the FERNTREE GULLY RECREATION GROUND recently purchased by the council. - The president moved, and Cr.
