Newspaper Notes

RDCA Competition commences with five teams – Gully still playing arranged matches, albeit against local teams from the surrounding districts – the forerunner to the Mountain District Cricket Association which was to form one season later in 1921/22.

17/9/1920 **RCC** Report on the RINGWOOD CRICKET CLUB Annual General Meeting, their success in gaining the Shield from the 1919/20 season, Office Bearers election and the formation of a new Cricket Association in the Ringwood District...

NEW ASSOCIATION FORMED – Cr. Miles (A.T.), said he had much pleasure in presenting a shield if a new association to be called the RINGWOOD and DISTRICT CRICKET ASSOCIATION could be formed for competition by the clubs joining the new association. He did not think it wise to go further than Mitcham and from what he had heard CROYDON and BAYSWATER were willing to join them. They would have to decide at one what they were going to do as the delegates would meet at Box Hill on the following night to arrange for the “Reporter” Competition for this year.

The meeting was unanimous in accepting the offer to give a shield for competition, and a motion was passed that an association be formed to be called the RINGWOOD and DISTRICT CRICKET ASSOCIATION. The area comprised in the new association will be as follows: Shires of Lilydale, and Ferntree Gully, and Mitcham, Warrandyte and Vermont.

In order to expedite matters and to organise the new association on a working basis, the following were appointed to interview the clubs in the areas above named: - Mr. Miles (Chairman), R. Goodall (Secretary) and Messrs Howship, Wilkins and J. Goodall. The Meeting will be held in Ringwood on Monday 25th inst. when it is hoped all details in connection with the new association will be satisfactorily settled.

12/11/1920 **MOUNT** (From a correspondent in Brunswick) - You might inform your readers that the BRUNSWICK CRICKET CLUB will journey to Ferntree Gully, Saturday (tomorrow), November 13th, to play the local club's 15. A collection will be taken up by the Returned Soldiers of that District in aid of a Memorial Hall. Cup cricket at Emerald – report on the coming season at the EMERALD CRICKET CLUB

25/12/1920 **FOOTI** C.A.C. vs. FERNTREE GULLY: The above match was played on Saturday (18/12/1920) at Ferntree Gully and resulted in a win for C.A.C. by 16 runs. Scores C.A.C. 40 (H. Corby 14, T. Wheatley 15, F. Carrington 4/18, T. Clohesy 6/22), FTG 24 (T. Clohesy 8, F. Carrington 5, J.E. Wheatley 7/5, L. Black 3/13)

25/2/1921 **BHR** Ex FERNTREE GULLY star cricketer Paddy Gilchrist took all 10 wickets when representing NORTH MELBOURNE in their match against the REPORTER DISTRICT team last Wednesday. He capped off his 10/22 with a top score of 43 as the NORTHERNER'S won comfortably 143 to 103.

11/3/1921 **MOUNT** On Saturday (8/3) we were honoured with a team of cricketers from EMERALD who contested with the local boys on the RECREATION RESERVE. A very fine afternoon's sport was enjoyed, and the pleasure of having EMERALD with us on the cricket field was great.

18/3/1921 **MOUNT** Captain Nobelius and his team were warmly welcomed on the FERNTREE GULLY RECREATION RESERVE on Saturday last (8/3/1921). EMERALD Cricketers are ever welcomed at the Gully. They bring with them such a fine sporting spirit. FERNTREE GULLY gave them a good battle coming out winners with a score of 137 as against EMERALD 48. E. Clohesy 55, W. Armstrong 24, W. Pickett 24 were the top scorers for the Gully. Ted Clohesy repeated his efforts taking 6/27. Captain Nobelius top scored for the visitors with 10 while Carrington got 4 wickets. The difference between the two teams was that little bit of puzzlement that kept working into Clohesy's deliveries. Every now and then when least expected they would get past the bat and over went the sticks. An enjoyable afternoon's sport was well spent.

8/4/1921 **MOUNT** The return match between EMERALD and FERNTREE GULLY was played on Emerald Oval on Saturday last (2/4/1921). As usual when these teams meet, and enjoyable game ensues, and this game was no exception to the rule, the GULLY boys fully upholding their reputation as good sports. The visitors had first use of the wicket, putting together 128 runs. Armstrong, when batting splendidly had the misfortune of being run out. Carrington, G. Pickett and A. Miller batted soundly, the latter being bowled by one out of the bag by Captain Hunt. EMERALD in their attempt started badly being five wickets down for 47 when D. Stuart joined A. Nobelius, who was batting splendidly – the first four stroked by the former realising 18 runs. A beautiful sixer was hit off A. Pickett. With the total on 114, Stuart was caught out and the 7th and 8th wicket fell at 121. The excitement was intense, especially as it was only a few minutes to time. Nobelius restraining his inclination to hit out, played doggedly eventually making the winning hit amidst applause and carrying his bat for 66 – a very plucky and invaluable innings. EMERALD thus won by three wickets and 10 runs – each team playing 12 men. **Refer Scorebook.**

20/5/1921 **MOUNT** The sheep on the FERNTREE GULLY RECREATION RESERVE are more of a nuisance than a benefit as the reserve is used almost continually as a sports ground. The sheep have to eat the grass in less time than they have been doing for the same money and not camp in the vicinity of the dressing rooms!

3/6/1921 **MOUNT** Article on reformation of BELGRAVE CRICKET CLUB under Mr. F.L. Byrne and sent in by F.W. Carrington approaches to the “Mountaineer” in regard to the favourable formation of a MOUNTAINEER CRICKET ASSOCIATION like that of Football formed this year. A new player listed at the FTGFC – Surname Crompton.

8/7/1921 **MOUNT** Interest is being shown by cricketers in the districts of MACCLESFIELD, EMERALD, MONBULK, OLINDA, FERNY CREEK, BELGRAVE, FERNTREE GULLY, BAYSWATER and possibly MONTROSE in forming a MOUNTAIN DISTRICT CRICKET ASSOCIATION.

15/7/1921 **MOUNT** Further comment on MDCA formation
