**10/10/1883**      **DA**      The 1883/84 Fictured matches for the DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB include October 20 vs FERNTREE GULLY and March 22 vs FERNTREE GULLY

**17/10/1883**      **SBMJ**      The following players have been chosen to represent the DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB at Ferntree Gully next Saturday (20/10/1883); R. Keys, J. Keys, I. Keys, T. McMahon, J. Dowell, G. Hyde, Tuckfield, Street, Brownfield, McQueen, Purdy and W.G. Keys

**24/10/1883**      **DA**      The first match of the FERNTREE GULLY was played last Saturday (20/10/1883) against DANDENONG and resulted in a win for the GULLYITES. **Refer Scorebook.**

**24/10/1883**      **SBMJ**      The DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB played the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB on Saturday October 20<sup>th</sup> at Ferntree Gully. The DANDENONG skipper winning the toss, elected to bat: all the team not having arrived on the ground. The wicket was greatly in favour of the bowler, the ball played very dangerously, which accounts for the minor score made by the DANDENONG in the first innings. **Refer Scorebook.**

**31/10/1883**      **SBMJ**      The DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB must look well to its laurels after its defeat by a comparatively outside team like FERNTREE GULLY. No doubt there is a deal of luck in the good old English sport, but an investigation of the individual scores of the recent match convinces one that the DANDENONG invincibles are not in form, or the bowling of the GULLY was too good for them. Surprise is heightened when it is remembered that the match was played on matting on which DANDENONG is supposed to be peculiarly at home. The return match will be anxiously awaited by all lovers of the game. Since the GULLY club has emerged from its shell, perhaps OAKLEIGH would deign to try conclusions with it.

**3/11/1883**      **PTEL**      PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S CLUB BY POINT: Last Thursday (1/11/1883) being a members' day, the Secretary thought it advisable to get a club match on for the first eleven team, so as to let those who only play now and again have a better show for a game, and accordingly he got a match on with the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB, to play on their ground. The Secretary, after having hunted about for players, at last got together a very good team, consisting of Opray, Walker, Dines, Read, Waller, Daley, Ryall, Banfield, Dunham, Furneaux, Annear, and Osborne, who left Prahran at 9 o'clock in the morning, in one of Mr. Osborne's drags, drawn by three spanking horses. The weather at that time, looking anything but promising, but nothing daunted, we proceeded on our way, and reached Ferntree Gully about eleven o'clock, after a very pleasant drive. After we had partaken of a cold luncheon, we proceeded to the ground, which we found was nothing but a paddock with a small piece cleared, so as to place a piece of cocoanut matting down on, which did not make a very good wicket. The fielding ground was something horrible, holes, pools of water, etc, making it very difficult to field on.

**Mr. McQuade**, having won the toss from our skipper, decided to put us in. Ryall and Dines led off for PRAHRAN and were making a very good stand till Dines slipped in trying a run, and was run out, 1 for 11. Walker joined Ryall, and made matters very lively for the field, he hitting out freely till the score numbered 51, when Ryall was bowled for 17. Dunham followed and made 4, Opray next, and then Waller's time had come, he getting bowled after having made 30, Opray played a good innings for 35, Furneaux 0, Walker 3, Annear 7, Banfield 10, Daley 3, Osborne 1, Read 4 not out, doing their share for PRAHRAN, the innings terminating for 134 runs, a very respectable score considering the ground and wicket. McQuade and Williams were the most successful bowlers for the FERNTREE GULLY. The FERNTREE GULLY went in to bat, but shaped rather tamely, the team only making 36 runs, Charman being the only player to get into double figures, he scoring 12. Ryall 8 for 10 and Opray 3 for 21 did the bowling for the PRAHRAN; the PRAHRAN thus winning by 98 runs.

After the game was finished, the FERNTREE GULLY team invited us to dinner, and it reflects great credit upon Mr. and Mrs. McQuade, of the Hunting Tower Hotel, for the manner in which the tables were laid out, there being no scarcity of eatables or drinkables, and also there being a variety of dishes, and I may say that one and all heartily enjoyed the good things provided. After the inner man had been replenished, Mr. Read, on behalf of the PRAHRAN, proposed the health of the members of the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB, which was drunk with musical honours, after which we thought it advisable to make a start for Prahran, which was reached about 9 o'clock, all well satisfied with our days outing. **Refer Scorebook.**

**7/11/1883**      **DA**      PRAHRAN TRADES vs FERNTREE GULLY: Last Thursday (1/11/1883) being a member's day, the secretary of the TRADES CLUB thought it admirable to get a match on for the first eleven and a match was arranged with the above club. The TRADES comprising... left Prahran at 9:00 in one of Mr. Osborne's drags and reached the Gully at 11:00. **P. McQuade (FERNTREE GULLY Captain)** won the toss and decided to put the visitors in. After the game was finished, the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB invited the visitors to a first class dinner, and it reflects great credit on Mr. and Mrs. McQuade, of the Huntingtower Hotel, for the manner in which the tables were laid out there being no scarcity of eatables or drinkables then there being a variety of dishes and all seemed to enjoy themselves heartily. After the inner man had been replenished, Mr. Reid proposed the health of the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB, which was drunk with musical honours, and suitably responded to. **Refer Scorebook.**

**9/11/1883**      **HAWB**      RINGWOOD vs FERNTREE GULLY; This match was played at Ringwood on Saturday (3/11/1883) and resulted in a victory for the locals, time not allowing the second innings to be completed. The scoring was RINGWOOD 1<sup>st</sup> Innings 30, 2<sup>nd</sup> Innings 25, FERNTREE GULLY 1<sup>st</sup> Innings 18, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Innings for 3 wickets down 12. The highest scores were Dawes for RINGWOOD with 14 and Charman for FERNTREE GULLY with 4. Good service was performed in the bowling by Monckton who obtained 6 wickets for 8 runs.

**14/11/1883**      **DA**      Friday last (9/11/1883) being the Prince of Wales Birthday, pleasure seekers and picnic parties to our valley were plenty. The principle attraction to the district was the cricket match between the local club and a team from CULLIS, HILL & CO. The latter won the toss and decided to hurl the willow and were not disposed of until 96 runs were to their credit – Solly batting well for 29 and Richardson for 19. The GULLY CLUB cut a sorry figure at the wickets, and if the match could have been played out (rain prevented it), they would have suffered a disgraceful defeat, for at the time when stumps were drawn, they were six wickets down for 11 runs – Hewitt playing havoc with the wickets

After the game, the two teams sat down for an excellent lunch provided by Mrs. McQuade in her usual creditable style. When ample justice had been done to the good things, success to the local club was given by the captain of the city team (Mr. Solly), which was ably responded to by Mr. J.T. Dobson. The visitors departed giving forth to the usual strains of 'They are jolly good fellows' ...

**12/12/1883**      **DA**      A match was played on December 1<sup>st</sup> between FERNTREE GULLY and OAKLEIGH which resulted in a draw. OAKLEIGH made 127 with FERNTREE GULLY replying with 58 for 6 wickets. H. Williams 14, Dobson 14 and Charman 10\* being the only locals to reach double figures. Licenses issued for P.J. McQuade (Huntingtower Hotel) and T.S. Grimwood (Ferntree Gully Hotel)

**5/1/1884**      **PTEL**      St. KILDA TRADESMEN's CRICKET CLUB; The above club will send out two elevens next Thursday (10/1/1884), The first will play against FERNTREE GULLY on the St. Kilda ground at 2 o'clock. This eleven will be made up of Kinder, Clapham, Gough, Hopper, Punshon, Prescott, Marden, Thompson, Asker, Neck, Lind, Wilcock and Knox.

**12/1/1884**      **PTEL**      St. KILDA TRADESMEN's CRICKET CLUB; The members of the above club commenced operations for the second half of the season on Thursday last (10/1/1884), when the first eleven played the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB on the St. Kilda ground, which resulted in a very close game, the GULLYITES winning by three runs only.

For ST. KILDA, Thompson 16, Hooper 12 not out were the highest scorers, the bowling honours being carried off by Thompson 3/2, Prescott 7/33, Asker 1/15. For FERNTREE GULLY, Armstrong (20), and Williams (10), were the highest scorers. For the bowling McQuade 3/6 and Daly 6/20 were best. The scores were FERNTREE GULLY 53, ST. KILDA 50.

**19/1/1884**      **PTEL**      PRAHRAN TRADESMEN's CRICKET CLUB; Last Thursday (17/1/1884) the first eleven of the above named club had to play an eleven from FERNTREE GULLY, on the Warehousemen's Cricket Ground. The game was to have been started at 12 o'clock, so as to allow for an interval at half past one for lunch but owing to the non arrival of the members of the FERNTREE GULLY team, who could only muster five players at two o'clock, it was decided to have lunch first and then commence the game.

After the inner man had been satisfied, we found that it was nearly three o'clock. The balance of the FERNTREE GULLY team, not having then turned up, we allowed them to pick players from those on the ground. The coin having been tossed for the choice of innings and fortune favouring our captain, he decided to put them into bat, so as to give them more time for their members to roll up. We, having taken the field, W. **19/3/1884**      **DA**      Names of DANDENONG representatives in the match played next Saturday (22/3/1884) between the DANDENONG and FERNTREE GULLY CLUBS at Dandenong Park.

**19/3/1884**      **SBMJ**      A match will be played on Saturday (22/3/1884) next in Dandenong Park between the DANDENONG and FERNTREE GULLY CLUBS. The DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB will be represented by....

**26/3/1884**      **DA**      The DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB was put through willow drill on Saturday (22/3/1884) by the FERNTREE GULLY combination (No scores published)

**19/4/1884**      **STKT**      MERVILLE v FERNTREE GULLY; This match was played on Easter Monday (14/4/1884) at Ferntree Gully, and resulted in a win for the former by 14 runs, the scores being: - MERVILLE 123, FERNTREE GULLY 109. For the former Wade 29, Miller 19, Hunt 17, Ewing 15 not out and B. Nicholson 10 batted well, while with the ball Featherstone, McCutcheon, B. Nicholson, Wade, Sims, and Hunt performed admirably. For the latter W. Williams (of the Highbury), 30 and Blyth, of the same club, performed well with bat and ball

**23/4/1884**      **DA**      In winding up the Season, the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB has arranged a match for a dinner, to be played next Saturday (26/4/1884) between the Marrieds' and the Bachelors of the Club. Great local interest is taken in the match and long odds are offered in favour of the "Old Buffers".

**14/5/1884**      **DA**      The local CRICKET CLUB intends winding up the season with a ball and supper to take place on Friday night previous to Her Majesty's birthday - 24<sup>th</sup> May. In glancing over the records of the Club for the past season, I find it has been the best ever brought to a close. Defeats have resulted during the term, but what club has not suffered during accordingly?

The victories gained will far more than compensate for the defeats, and when remembering that it is only a country club, consisting but of working men, with not much time to practise, I claim that wonders have been accomplished.

The match which was to have been played between the MARRIED'S and SINGLE members of the club lapsed in consequence of the roughness of the weather. But on Saturday week (3/5/1884) the last match of the season was played at the GULLY between the home team and a team representing LYSTERFIELD. The latter suffered such a defeat I feel backward in publishing the figures.

FERNTREE GULLY made 185 in their first innings, McQuade carrying his bat for 97 runs, **(the first recorded occurrence of Batting through the Innings in Club history)** while H. Williams ran his score up to 50. The visitors were all out for 23 runs, not one being able to make any stand whatever. Amongst the visitors I noticed Messrs. Andrew Smith, C. Smith and J. McRae.

**4/6/1884**            **DA**            The long talked of ball and supper in connection with the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB is now over and it may be pronounced a gathering of no small merit.

**4/6/1884**            **SBMJ**            The local CRICKET CLUB wound up the season with a ball and supper on Friday evening 23rd which was a thoroughly enjoyable affair, and although the weather was unpropitious the votaries of Terpsichore, turned out in goodly numbers. The catering was entrusted to Mr. Trounsen of Dandenong and gave general satisfaction.

Dancing was kept up without intermission until the wee small hours and warned those who were desirous of taking part in the annual sports next day that an interval of a few hours rest would the better enable them to enjoy the day and they accordingly dispersed.
