Newspaper Notes

14/11/1888 **SBMJ** I imagine the lovers of cricket must have been satisfied on the 9th inst. As there were two matches played here – one at Potter's Hotel (**Club Hotel**), the contestants being an eleven from PATTERSON, LAING & BRUCE'S establishment and an impromptu local team which were chosen hurriedly. Owing to the brief notice given the match was shorn of a good deal of interest; however, the locals scored a victory.

The match which was played on the Glenfern Oval was looked forward to with more interest, as it was a contest between two old rivals, the MALVERN and GLENFERN clubs. The locals suffered a defeat owing to the absence of some of their best men but there is reason to hope that the tables may be turned, when the return match is played. At the conclusion of the days play, both teams, with their friends adjourned to Hostess Blair's, where a table literally groaning with edibles of every description awaited them, to which ample justice was done, as after the days exertions each cricketer was perfectly aware that the "inner man needed replenishing".

About seventy sat down to dinner. The good feeling that exists among cricketers prevailed throughout, and the toasts incidental to such gatherings, were proposed and responded to, after which the MALVERN team departed with three hearty cheers following in their wake – anxious wishes that they might experience a safe journey and success in the future.

1/12/1888 **PTEL** OTHER MATCHES. The MALVERN and FERNTREE GULLY CC. on Friday, 23rd November, played on the ground of the former. The FERNTREE GULLY came through the kind invitation of J.J. Hewitt, the well-known contractor, who entertained the teams with a dinner, and on the conclusion of the match an adjournment was again made to Mr Hewitt's residence, where the members of the team enjoyed themselves to the full. Before leaving the team thanked Mr. Hewitt for his kindness, giving three hearty cheers.

The former made 101, H. Williams 28, W. Williams 16, and Bateman 24; while the GULLY made 122, Newman (substitute) 36 (not out), Oldham 22, and G. Williams 18. The latter won by 21 runs. The bowling was done by - MALVERN, O. Williams, 4 for 54; Crane, 1 for 9; Hewitt, 1 for 18; Gully, G. Williams, 6 for 27; Stevens, 4 for 35.

23/1/1889 **SBMJ** A cricket match was played on the GLENFERN ground on Saturday afternoon (19/1/1889) between the local club and a team from CULLIS, HILL & CO's establishment, the result being that the visitors were defeated by a "tremendous majority".

30/1/1889 **LILEX** In the match CROYDON v. FERN TREE GULLY, at Fern Tree Gully, on Saturday next, the Croydon team will be chosen from the following members: Messrs Hardidge, Jenkins, Maggs, McGiveren (**McGivern**), Sherlock, Styles (2), Tosch, Walker, Windley, Wirk, Burke, and Smeaton.

30/1/1889 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY vs L. STEVENSON & SONS: The above match was played on Saturday last (26/1/1889) at Ferntree Gully (26/1/1889) resulting in a decided victory for the home team who scored 160 for the loss of 5 wickets against 63 scored by the visitors.

FERNTREE GULLY plays MALVERN next Saturday (2/2/1889) on the ground of the former at 1:00 p.m.

6/2/1889 **SBMJ** The cricket match which was played here last Saturday (2/2/1889) between a strong team from MALVERN and the locals, resulted in a victory for the former. At the conclusion of play both teams adjourned to Hostess Blair's Hotel, where a table literally groaning with edibles of every description awaited them, to which, I need not say the jovial cricketers did ample justice.

Many toasts were proposed and responded to notably the first on the program "Her Majesty the Queen" which was duly honoured in the orthodox manner so peculiar to Englishmen, or the descendants of that good old race, which is being gradually supplemented by another, whether for good or evil none of us can say. At any rate as far as I am concerned, I shall always adhere to the good old land.

20/2/1889 **SBMJ** A cricket match was played here on Thursday (14/2/1889) between a team from SOUTH MELBOURNE and the local men, which resulted in a draw in favour of the locals. The game, which was very exciting, lasted nearly all day. At its conclusion both teams sat down to a sumptuous repast in Mrs. Blair's usual style "full and plenty and everything of the best".

25/2/1889 **ARGUS** A match will take place on the South Melbourne ground tomorrow (Tuesday 26/2/1889) between SOUTH MELBOURNE and 15 of the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB. Play will commence at 11:00 o'clock.

26/2/1889 **ARGUS** SOUTH MELBOURNE vs FERNTREE GULLY (15): This match will take place today (Tuesday) on the South Melbourne ground, play to commence at 11:00 o'clock sharp. The SOUTH MELBOURNE team will be as follows: W. Aitken, J. Barrett, R. Barrett, E. Barrett, A. Bowman, A. Bothard, G. McGinnis, M. Minchin, S. Morris, A. Noall, E. Rush, H. Steele, A. Tarrant, G.H. Trott

28/2/1889 **SPMAN** SOUTH MELBOURNE vs FERNTREE GULLY (15): A Match was played last week (Tuesday 26/2/1889) on the ground of the former.

The SOUTH MELBOURNE, winning the toss elected to bat, and succeeded in scoring 192 (Bowman 47, Trott 28, Minchin 28, E. Barrett 27* and Bothard 20 batted splendidly. FERNTREE GULLY was disposed of for 79 runs, SOUTH MELBOURNE thus winning by 113 runs. Trott 5/19 and Morris 7/43 bowled splendidly. **Refer Scorebook.**

28/2/1889 **ARGUS** SOUTH MELBOURNE vs FERNTREE GULLY (15): A match between the above teams was played on Tuesday (26/2/1889) on the ground of the former. The SOUTH MELBOURNE, winning the toss elected to bat, and succeeded in scoring 192 (Bowman 47, Trott 28, Minchin 28, E. Barrett 27* and Bothard 20 batted splendidly.

FERNTREE GULLY then went to the wickets but was soon disposed of for 79 runs, SOUTH MELBOURNE thus winning by 113 runs. Trott 5/19 and Morris 7/43 bowled splendidly. **Refer Scorebook.** **NOTE: This suggests the match was played against an 'odds' team from Ferntree Gully as at least 12 wickets were taken by G.H. Trott and S. Morris (both were Australian Test players) in combination.**

2/3/1889 **AUST** SOUTH MELBOURNE vs FERNTREE GULLY (15): A match was played last week (26/2/1889) on the ground of the former.

The SOUTH MELBOURNE, winning the toss elected to bat, and succeeded in scoring 192 (Bowman 47, Trott 28, Minchin 28, E. Barrett 27* and Bothard 20 batted splendidly. FERNTREE GULLY was disposed of for 79 runs, SOUTH MELBOURNE thus winning by 113 runs. Trott 5/19 and Morris 7/43 bowled capitally. **Refer Scorebook.**

6/3/1889 **SPMAN** SOUTH MELBOURNE vs FERNTREE GULLY (15): A match was played last week (26/2/1889) on the ground of the former.

The SOUTH MELBOURNE, winning the toss elected to bat, and succeeded in scoring 192 (Bowman 47, Trott 28, Minchin 28, E. Barrett 27* and Bothard 20 batted splendidly. FERNTREE GULLY was disposed of for 79 runs, SOUTH MELBOURNE thus winning by 113 runs. Trott 5/19 and Morris 7/43 bowled capitally. **Refer Scorebook.**

9/3/1889 **LILEX** CRICKET - A match will be played this afternoon on the Lilydale Cricket Ground between the LILYDALE UNION AND THE REST and a club from Fern Tree Gully. The LILYDALE team will be chosen from: - M [Illeg], Poyner (2), Bolitho, Hill (2), [Illeg], Strachan, Hooper, Oliver, Mitchell, [Illeg], Cunliffe, Currow, Humphries, Johnstone, R.T. Kings, Thomas, Hutchinson.

14/3/1889 **DA** GLENFERN vs NARRE WARREN: These two teams met at Ferntree Gully on Saturday 23rd February with the latter having a quite unpleasant day's leather hunting. Scores included Baker 1, A. Smith 11, A. Selman 11, E. Selman 27, G. Williams 3, A. Lording 2, E. Lording 81, Martin 6, F. Lording 26, H.T. Calder 99*, W. Dawson 34 and Sundries 20 totalling 321 whilst the bowling honours went to E. Lording and G. Williams with 5 wickets each. H.T. Calder's score was the highest yet achieved in the district. **Refer Scorebook.**

1/5/1889 **SBMJ** A Meeting of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB was held at the Ferntree Gully Hotel on the 27th April for the purpose of forming a committee to make arrangements to carry out the forthcoming concert and ball on the 24th May (Queen's Birthday) in aid of funds of the club. A football match has been arranged on the same day.

8/5/1889 **SBMJ** The program of amusements which are provided for the 24th inst (Queen's Birthday) ought to satisfy the most fastidious, as in addition to the cricket match a team of footballers from Messrs BRUCE & CO's establishment intend paying us a visit to try conclusions with our local aspirants. A ball and concert will take place at Dobson's Hall in the evening in aid of the funds of the cricket club which, with fine weather, I am confident will be well attended.

30/5/1889 **DA** GLENFERN CRICKET CLUB CONCERT & BALL, FERNTREE GULLY; To those who follow the course of cricket and apply their respective talents to the game and become cultivated in its general pursuits, acquire an almost unlimited desire and dedication to exclude all other pastimes from the education of sport. Cricket in the Gully is by no means a new attainment, for upwards of 14 years ago the charms of this game existed, and since that period it has steadily increased with the times, to boast of two cricket clubs in the Ferntree Gully. **NOTE: Dates the origins of cricket in Ferntree Gully to 1875!**

The GLENFERN CLUB may be ranked as the premier cub in the district, on account perhaps of its many advantages and as old established, a good pitch for the wicket and its members of superior school in the points of the game, having with it the general support of the residents of Ferntree Gully, and the bumper house that responded to their calling the evening of the 24th inst, shows that GLENFERN CLUB provides the tone of support for the whole district.

The scene of the gathering was Dobson's Hall, which was decorated with flags, and the front of the stage was marked with emblems of cricket which would soon tell to the visitor what the concert was in aid of.

The **President of the club, Mr. T.S. Grimwood** performed the duties of chairman, and when we remember the veteran of sport long ago cannot but say he is a wonder of the nineteenth century. He provided to the evening all the qualities of a model chairman, his task was but of an easy turn, his omniscience appearance on the stage made him the right man in the right place. In opening the concert, the chairman gave a brief history of the club's doings for the past season, which showed that GLENFERN was no myth on the cricket field.

The ball was set in motion by a Pianoforte Duet (Canary Birds), by Misses Lording and Selman, which was rendered sweetly and well applauded; the Skipper's Flag; sung by Mr. J.C. Robertson, fell to good hands and commanded the attention of the audience, the Old Brigade by Mr. Calder; was loudly encored and responded to, Song by Miss Selman (Listening); was sung with expression and received a well merited encore, True till Death, sung by Mr. W.L. Lording was sung with spirit and responded to by applause; Rocked in the Cradle of the Deep was the song of the evening, and could not be put in better hands than Mr. Perkins, who received the appreciation of the audience in a deserving encore... **ZZZ continues but blurred copy and needs further analysis...**

Monk, the M.C. was as usual in good form, and the floor was perfection, the Music, Harp and Violin was perfect, giving general satisfaction to all. The ladies were again to the fore by way of dress, and although appearing in evening dress, there was taste and neatness displayed. Mrs Cove and Mrs J. Breen were attentive to the wants of the refreshment table. The GLENFERN CRICKET CLUB may be congratulated on the success that crowned their efforts on the evening of the 24th inst...

The ball room was the scene of gaiety until daylight, when the party separated and ended the GLENFERN CRICKET CLUB concert and ball of 1889.

13/7/1889 **OFTG** On Saturday last (6th July) a Meeting of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB was held at Mrs. Blair's Hotel, when the **Secretary's (H.T. Calder)** report and balance sheet for the season 1888/89 was presented, along with the Batting and Bowling averages. The Secretary's Report shows the club to have played 14 matches, 9 of which were won, 4 lost and 1 drawn. The matches won include SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES, MALVERN, Messrs CULLIS, HILL & CO, Messrs L. STEVENSON & SONS, NARRE WARREN & KEW.

The batting trophy, presented by Mr. T.S. Grimwood, has been won by **Geo Williams**, T. Smith not having played in enough matches to claim the trophy. The bowling trophy was presented by Mr. Grimwood to **F. Stevens**, who achieved an average of 4.6 having bowled 530 balls for 128 runs for 28 wickets et al...

The Batting averages were; T. Smith 51.80, **G. Williams 38.80**, H.T. Calder 31.3, J. Munro 21, F. Lording 18.7, W. Dawson 18.1, J Lording 14.4, E. Lording 13.4, B. Carey 11, T. Williams 10, E. Selman 8.7, E.H. Baker 8, A. Smith 7.7, A.J. Martin 6, F. Stevens 4.7, while the Bowling Averages were **F. Stevens 4.6**, G. Williams 5.4, T. Smith 6.5, E. Lording 7.6, J. Lording 8.5 and T. Williams 12.2

24/7/1889 **SBMJ** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB Annual Dinner, Responding to the invitation of **Mr. T.S. Grimwood, the President of the above club**, about 40 gentlemen sat down to dinner at Mrs. Blair's Ferntree Gully Hotel. The guests present included the members of the club, their friends and other visitors. The dining room was tastefully decorated with a lot of flowers, evergreens and flags, and the tables were filled with the choicest edibles that could be procured.

The chair was occupied by Mr. Grimwood, who proposed the toast of the Queen, which was heartily responded to. **Mr. E. Thompson, Vice President** proposed the health of the members of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB. He congratulated them on the success of the past season, the popularity of the club and the satisfactory condition of the funds, and his toast was accompanied by the company singing 'for they are jolly good fellows'...

Among others mentioned in a long article are Messer's Munro, Brokenshire, Calder, Davis, Baker, Stevens (best bowler), Williams (best batsman), Lording (Secretary for the night), Brodie, Martin, Mrs. Blair, E. Selman, F. Clarke (Representing the SBMJ) Clark (From RINGWOOD CRICKET CLUB), E. Thompson, R. Vaughan.

27/7/1889 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB Annual Dinner, A most enjoyable evening was spent at Mrs. Blair's Hotel on Thursday 19th July, the occasion being the first annual cricket dinner, being given by **Mr. T.S. Grimwood, President of the club...**
