22/8/1889 DA The GLENFERN (FERNTREE GULLY) CRICKET CLUB gave a dinner to their [President, Tom Grimwood](#), on Tuesday evening. The meeting was a very social one and songs and speeches beguiled the hours until they were small in the morning. During the evening Mr. Grimwood proposed "The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB" and was proud that from it they could pick men who could hold their own against men in any suburban club out of Melbourne in bowling, batting and fielding. He had the pleasure of presenting two Gold Medals to Messrs. George Williams and Fred Stevens for the top score and best bowling average in the club during the season just past. [Mr. Stevens in response said that as Captain](#) he would always do his best without fear or favour to advance the club. He hoped that next year some others would gain the trophies by beating himself and Williams. Mr. Williams also acknowledged the presentation. Among those present were Munro, Hughes, Selman, Baker, Brodie, Martin, Bambury, F.C. Lording, Vaughan, Carey, R. Hughes, Moore, A. Lording, E.L. Thompson and F. Stevens.

12/10/1889 OFTG The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB played MITCHAM last Saturday (5/10/1889) at Mitcham, and won by 6 wickets and 27 runs, 4/107 to 80. For the GULLY, Wallace made 40 not out and T. Williams 20 not out. **Refer Scorebook.**

16/10/1889 SBMJ The DANDENONG cricketers were badly beaten on Saturday (12/10/1889) at Ferntree Gully (Front Page with report below later in SBMJ)

16/10/1889 SBMJ DANDENONG vs FERNTREE GULLY: The cricket match which was contested on Saturday (12/10/1889) between the local team and a team from DANDENONG resulted in a victory for the former team by 2 wickets and 67 runs. I believe this is the first time these two clubs have met as the prestige of Hyde, Dowell and others have deterred our boys (DANDENONG) from inviting them over. However, owing to the indomitable pluck displayed by the local team, it was plain to be seen that it would take a stronger team than that of DANDENONG to put them through. The FERNTREE GULLY team have played 2 matches this season and they have been victorious in both. **Refer Scorebook.**

The opening match for this season was played on Saturday last between the above clubs, on the ground of the latter, and resulted in an easy win for the locals by 67 runs and 2 wickets to spare. The drive to Ferntree Gully was very pleasant, the weather being fine and the road in good condition.

When the visitors arrived on the ground they were agreeably surprised to find a Grand Stand had lately been erected and were grateful to the FERNTREE GULLY lads who had provided a sumptuous repast therein to which the visitors did ample justice and in the opinion of some this latter fact had something to do with form shown by the Dandenongites in the field, stooping being done very slowly and carefully.

The local skipper (H.T. Calder) won the toss and elected to take the field. Hyde and Keys opened the game for DANDENONG, and they and H. Renfree were the only ones to make any stand against the bowling of Williams and Lording.

The last wicket fell for 68, there being no less than five ducks in the team. The locals then went in and displayed good form, playing the dangerous balls and sending the loose ones all over the field. Calder played a grand game not giving a chance while compiling his score of 44.

17/10/1889 DA Our cricketers put your crack team (DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB) through very prettily on Saturday, before a large assembly of onlookers and will no doubt put a good number of teams through during the season. Of course, there is luck in cricket but there was not much chance work on Saturday when Williams and Calder slapped the bowlers about and there were not many wickets to fall.

The DANDENONG 1st XI journeyed to Ferntree Gully on Saturday (12/10/1889) and played the local team. The game resulted in a victory for the GULLY by 2 wickets and 67 runs. The visitors were treated to a choice cold collation to which justice was done. The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB have a pretty, picturesque ground behind Grimwood's Hotel; also erected a pavilion and something to eat in it – happily for the hungry team men last Saturday.

26/10/1889 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB is waiting for the apology of the OAKLEIGH CRICKET CLUB to keep their engagement to meet them last Saturday (19/10/89). We hear that not even the courtesy was shown of intimating that the appointment would not be kept.

The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB will hold their annual concert on November 9th. We learn that Mr. T.S. Grimwood has got a bowling club inaugurated at Ferntree Gully under satisfactory auspices.

The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET TEAM to meet MALVERN today at Ferntree Gully is Lording (3), Williams, Dawson, Munro, Calder, Stevens and Selman (2) – Emergencies Baker, Henley, and Hughes.

31/10/1889 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs MALVERN: A match was played on Saturday last (26/10/1889) between these two teams on Mrs. Blair's ground, Ferntree Gully. A wet morning delayed the arrival of the visitors until midday and play was not commenced until late. The ground had been well rolled and would have been in excellent playing condition but for the heavy rain overnight, which may probably account for the low scores made. **Refer Scorebook.**

2/11/1889 **OFTG** By a sort of poetical justice the OAKLEIGH CRICKET CLUB, who failed to keep their appointment with FERNTREE GULLY were disappointed of their match with DANDENONG last Saturday (26/10/1889), the club not putting in an appearance.

The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB played MALVERN at the Gully ground by Mrs. Blair's Hotel on Saturday last (26/10/1889). The MALVERNITES undeterred by the threatening weather arrived by a drag and proved to be in good form. Going first to the wicket they put together a total of 78 against which the locals only scored 38. Commencing a second innings MALVERN again made a stand showing 84 runs for 2 wickets. For MALVERN W. Williams (Ex FERNTREE GULLY) scored 37 and J. Wallace 21, (while Oliver Williams took 8 FERNTREE GULLY wickets in this match). For FERNTREE GULLY Dawson made 13 not out. Today FERNTREE GULLY and SOUTH YARRA are down to meet at the Gully – if Derby Day doesn't prove too big an attraction. **Refer Scorebook.**

7/11/1889 **DA** On the Prince of Wales birthday holiday (Thursday 14/11/1889) the WAVERLEY CRICKET CLUB will play a match against the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB at the ground of the latter and luncheon will be provided by Mr. Potter of the Club Hotel.

9/11/1889 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs CARRINGTON: The match was played on Cup Day (5/11/1889) at the ground of the former and resulted in a win to the GULLY by an innings and six runs – CARRINGTON 63 & 40, FTG 109. Brown played a good innings for the visitors and E. Lording and Calder with 37 and 36 batted well for the home team. The bowling of E. Lording and G. Williams was to slick for the visitors. **Refer Scorebook.**

9/11/1889 **SBMJ** A team from PATTERSON, LAING & BRUCE's journeyed to Ferntree Gully on the Prince of Wales Birthday (9/11/1889), to play the local club and after an exciting game won by nine runs, making 105 runs of which W.H. Mason scored 39, and Aylwin 23, as against the GULLY's 96, G. Williams scoring 39 and O. Williams 25. Taylor (4/27) and Mason (4/31) bowled well. The visitors were well entertained by the GULLY team. **Refer Scorebook.**

12/11/1889 **ARGUS** Report as above. **Refer Scorebook.**

14/11/1889 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs HAWTHORN: A match was played between these two teams on Mrs. Blair's ground on Cup Day (5/11/1889). FERNTREE GULLY won easily, Calder and E. Lording making a capital stand and G. Williams and E. Lording bowling remarkably well.

16/11/1889 **AUST** A team from PATERSON, LAING, AND BRUCE'S journeyed to Fern Tree Gully on the Prince of Wales' Birthday, to play the local club, and after an exciting game won by 9 runs, making 105 runs, of which W.H. Mason scored 40 and Aylwin 25, as against the FERNTREE GULLY'S 96, G. Williams scoring 35 and O. Williams 25. Taylor (four for 27) and Mason (four for 8) bowled well. The visitors were well entertained by the Gully team.

16/11/1889 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs PATTERSON, LAING & BRUCE: This match was played on the ground of the former (9/11/1889) and resulted in a win for the visitors by 9 runs 105 and 6/19 to 96.

CONCERT: *The twelfth annual concert in aid of the Gully CC was held on Prince of Wales Birth night (9/11/1889) in Dobson's Hall which was well filled before the time of commencement. This is followed up by a large Column of information with respect to attendees, singers and dances.*

NOTE: The twelfth (12th) annual concert suggests a commencement date of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB in 1877 – a statement no research has been able to prove/disprove, one way or another.

The earliest actual known cricket reference where FERNTREE GULLY is mentioned is the report in the SBMJ on the 1879/80 match against SCORESBY in March 1880. The early publications associated with the area now known as Ferntree Gully used to compile the information on the club's earliest years has been sourced from...

- The South Bourke & Mornington Journal SBMJ Commenced 1865, Microfilmed from 10th January 1877
- The Dandenong Advertiser DA Commenced 15th February 1882
- The Oakleigh & Ferntree Gully News OFTG Commenced 8th June 1889

28/11/1889 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADESMEN: On Thursday last (21/11/1889) a match was played between two elevens from the above clubs at Mrs. Blair's ground, FERNTREE GULLY. In the second innings the visitor's made 59 and FERNTREE GULLY 64 for the loss of 2 wickets. **Refer Scorebook.**

30/11/1889 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB were met on their own ground on November 21 by SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES. The match resulted in a draw. In the first innings the SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES scored 85 while their opponents scored 51. In the 2nd innings the Visitor's made 59 while the locals ran up 64 for the loss of only 2 wickets. **Refer Scorebook.**

12/12/1889 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs RINGWOOD: This match was played at Ringwood on Saturday (7/12/1889) and resulted in a victory for the FERNTREE GULLY team. We did not succeed in getting the scores.

14/12/1889 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB defeated the RINGWOOD team at Ringwood Saturday last 7/12/1889. **Refer Scorebook.**

14/12/1889 **PTEL** MOUNT ERICA WESLEY'S play FERNTREE GULLY on the ground of the latter

18/12/1889 **SBMJ** DANDENONG 1st XI meets FERNTREE GULLY next Saturday (21/12/1889) at Dandenong, play to commence at One O'clock

31/12/1889 **SPMAN** MALVERN vs KEW ASYLUM CRICKET CLUB played at Kew on Saturday last (28/12). MALVERN remained at the wicket all day, scoring 195 runs for five wickets. George J. Williams played a grand innings for 90 not out; O.S. Williams 45, H. Williams 22 and C. Daly 21 not out. The match will be continued next Saturday.

3/1/1890 **HER** EAST MELBOURNE ROVERS v. FERNTREE GULLY, at the Gully. Trains leave Prince's Bridge at 1.20 p.m. Rover's team - Bent, Chapman, Costelloe, Davies, Gordon, Grant, Hoskins, Carson, Mansfield, Bowden, Owen, Simeon, Jupp, Pearce, Waugh (2), Mullin, Reaby.

4/1/1890 **OFTG** Matthew Davies, Speaker for the Legislative Assembly of Victoria appointed a Knight – He was a frequent Patron of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB prior to the collapse of the land prices where he lost his entire fortune including his magnificent home at the Basin, "Doongalla" where he never actually resided before the banks foreclosed on his mortgage.

9/1/1890 **DA** On Saturday (4/1/1890) a match was played on Mrs. Blair's ground between twelve of the EAST MELBOURNE ROVERS and an equal number of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB. Fred Stevens bowled exceptionally well for the locals, taking in one innings all the wickets for 19 runs. EAST MELBOURNE totalled 38 against the local's 125. **Refer Scorebook.**

11/1/1890 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CLUB met EAST MELBOURNE ROVERS on the ground by Mrs. Blair's Ferntree Gully Hotel on Saturday last (4/1/1890) with twelve on each side. The local team were in good form and Stevens' bowling was terribly destructive. **Refer Scorebook.**

11/1/1890 **PTEL** PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S CLUB; The Ferntree Gully Trip will take place on the 23rd. Special arrangements have been made with the Railway Department and also for the catering at the Gully. Tickets (for members only), 6s each may be obtained from the secretary, and early application should be made so that the committee may be able to make their arrangements so as to make the affair a great success.

15/1/1890 **AGE** CRICKET; EAST MELBOURNE v. FERNTREE GULLY, This match takes place at Ferntree Gully today (Wednesday). E.M.C.C.: — Boyle, Broadbent, Dick, Harry, Hayes, Hickford, Lear, Lorraine, Mummery, Powys, Row, Worrall. All to meet at Princes bridge station at 10.10 a.m.

18/1/1890 **AGE** E.M.C.C. v. FERNTREE GULLY - This match was played at Ferntree Gully on Wednesday, 15th inst. E.M.C.C., 135 - Boyle, 38; Flynn, 19; Broadbent, 18; Harry, 17; Dick, 16. FERNTREE GULLY, 82 for nine wickets - Jones, 21; G. Williams, 15. **Refer Scorebook.**

18/1/1890 **PTEL** PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S CLUB; Last Thursday's Matches - Proposed Trip to Ferntree Gully.

Next Thursday will be a "member's day," and it is proposed to visit Ferntree Gully. Those who intend going should meet at the Richmond station at 7.15 on that morning, from whence they will be conveyed by rail to the Gully. Lunch will be provided at the "camping ground," at 11 a.m., and the morning having been spent in viewing the beauties of the place, a move will be made to Grimwood's Hotel, where dinner will be provided at one o'clock. In the afternoon a cricket match will be played between the first eleven and the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB, while those not taking part in the game, sports will be arranged. A match has been arranged with, the second eleven of ST. KILDA on the same date. Those who cannot go to Ferntree Gully are requested to meet at the Richmond cricket ground at 2 p.m.

22/1/1890 **SPMAN** The EAST MELBOURNE journeyed to Ferntree Gully to play a local team on Thursday (15/1/1890), the match resulting in a draw in favor of the EAST. Scores; EAST MELBOURNE, 135 (Boyle 38, Flynn 19, Broadbent 18, Harry 17, Hick 16, FERNTREE GULLY 9/82 (Jones 21, G. Williams 15, Blazey 11, E. Lording 10 run out). T. & G. Williams bowled well for the GULLY, taking 3/24 and 3/25 respectively. **Refer Scorebook.**

The FERNTREE GULLY and MITCHAM clubs met for the second time this season (the first resulting in a win for the GULLY by 5 wickets and 27 runs) on Saturday (18/1/1890). MITCHAM batted first, and succeeded in making 106, Geddes was top scorer with 32. GULLY first innings got 128 for 4 wickets, (G. Williams 76, E. Lording 19, Ed Selman 16 not out, being chief scorers. The match ended in a win for the GULLY by 6 wickets and 22 runs, T. Williams 4/22, E. Selman 2/21 trundled well for the latter. **Refer Scorebook.**

22/1/1890 **PTEL** THE PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S CLUB; About fifty members of the above club will proceed to Ferntree Gully to-morrow, leaving Richmond at 7.15 a.m. The morning will be spent in viewing the Gully, and other sights, and in the afternoon a cricket match will be played against the local club.

23/1/1890 **DA** A match between FERNTREE GULLY and EAST MELBOURNE was played on Wednesday 15th on Mrs. Blair's ground, Ferntree Gully. Owing to the absence of five or six of the best players, the home team was not up to its usual strength. The game resulted in a draw – 9/82 versus 135. FERNTREE GULLY vs MITCHAM: The first match between these clubs resulted in a win for the GULLY by 5 wickets and 26 runs. **Refer Scorebook.**

There was great excitement over the present match as the GULLYITES had a very poor team by their high standard representing the district, but they had a good deal of the best of the game and won by 6 wickets and 22 runs – 4/128 to 106 (inc. 20 sundries). FERNTREE GULLY plays PRAHRAN TRADES today (23/1/1890) at 2:00 pm on the ground of the former. On Saturday RINGWOOD play FERNTREE GULLY on the latter's ground.

24/1/1890 **FITZ** NORTH FITZROY IMPERIAL's vs FERNTREE GULLY: At Ferntree Gully (25/1/1890). IMPERIAL's team are to meet on the Prince's Bridge Railway Station at no later than 1:15 p.m. to catch the 1:20 p.m. train to Lower Ferntree Gully.

24/1/1890 **HER** **Tomorrow's Sports** – NORTH FITZROY IMPERIAL v. FERNTREE GULLY, on the ground of the latter, at Ferntree Gully

25/1/1890 **OFTG** The EAST MELBOURNE CRICKET CLUB paid a visit to Ferntree Gully on the 15th to try conclusions with the GULLY cricketers. A pleasant outing was enjoyed, and a fair contest resulted in a draw. **Refer Scorebook.** In the first match against MITCHAM, FERNTREE GULLY gained victory by 128 to 106 with six wickets to spare. G. Williams compiling 76 for the victors. **Refer Scorebook.**

A cricket match and a variety of sports were played between PRAHRAN TRADES and the FERNTREE's on Thursday 23rd after which a fine repast was enjoyed at Mrs. Blair's Hotel. The PRAHRAN TRADES had a 'Members Day' on Thursday and a picnicking excursion to Ferntree Gully was arranged.

The journey was accomplished by train and after an 'al fresco' luncheon an excellent dinner was partaken at Mrs. Blair's Hotel. A cricket match between the first eleven and the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB and a variety of sports comprised the afternoon's program

25/1/1890 **PTEL** PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S outing to Ferntree Gully a jolly success – an interesting sketch by "Tracker" on Wednesday. Look out for it! **Refer Scorebook.**

29/1/1890 **SPMAN** The FERNTREE GULLY and PRAHRAN TRADES played at the Gully on Wednesday (23/1/1890). The match resulted in a win for the "FERNIES" by 21 runs. The Scores: - TRADES 89 (Renfree 29 top scorer), FERNTREE GULLY 118 (G. Williams 28, W. Williams 14, Blazey 13, Houston 13, E. Lording 12 not out) were the double figure scorers. T. Williams bowled splendidly for the locals taking 5/14. **Refer Scorebook.**

The FERNTREE GULLY and NORTH FITZROY IMPERIAL was played on Saturday (25/1/1890) on the ground of the former, and the match resulted in an easy win for the GULLYITES by an innings and 38 runs. Scores: GULLY 96 (G. Williams 43, Hughes 19, E. Selman 10 not out), IMPERIAL 1st Innings 30, 2nd Innings 28, E. Selman 6/6, E. Lording 5/12, F. Stevens 5/13 and G. Williams 4/17, bowled in grand style for the winners. **Refer Scorebook.**

30/1/1890 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs PRAHRAN TRADES: This match was played on Wednesday week (23/1/1890) on the ground of the former and resulted in a win for the GULLY by 21 runs - 118 to 89. **Refer Scorebook.** **NOTE: Playing for the TRADES team were O. Williams 15 and 5 Wickets and H. Williams 6.** On Saturday (25/1/1890), the NORTH FITZROY IMPERIALS went to Ferntree Gully to try to get out the local team, but suffered a disastrous defeat, the match ending in a win for the GULLY by an innings and 38 runs. A match between FERNTREE GULLY (9/172) and RICHMOND CHURCHES ASSOCIATION (28) was played on Monday last (27/1/1890) and resulted in an easy win for the locals. **Refer Scorebook.**

31/1/1890 BHCE On Monday (27/1/1890) the RICHMOND CHURCH ASSOCIATION proceeded to Ferntree Gully to play the local team and found out like other teams that have journeyed in the same mission, that they had to contend against a really first class team. Owing to the phenomenal bowling of O. & T. Williams, the former could only total 28 runs, while the GULLY team had scored 172 runs for the loss of 9 wickets. For the losers, Darien and Green with 5 each were the highest scorers and Paton 4/12 and Hill 1/12 strove hard to prevent defeat. **Refer Scorebook.**

1/2/1890 PTEL A DAY WITH THE PRAHRAN TRADESMEN: A Trip to Fern-tree Gully [By "TRACKER"] Thursday week will be marked as a red letter day by the members of the above club as one of the most enjoyable of their outings. The weather was all that could be desired, as was also the spot chosen - Ferntree Gully, one of Victoria's most beautiful spots. The Richmond platform presented an animated appearance as the 7.20 a.m. train steamed into the station, and fifty four members took their seats in the carriages reserved for them.

After a very pleasant journey, Upper Ferntree Gully station was reached about 9 o'clock, and a start was immediately made for the entrance to the Gully, a distance of a mile; and after removing all superfluous clothing, our energetic secretary, Cr. Davies, led the way, followed by forty of the excursionists, (many preferring to stay at the camping ground, having previously been up the Gully). The nature of the journey was soon apparent by several declaring that they had gone far enough; but the encouraging remarks from those ahead would cause the rear of the train to try again, and with the agility of acrobats, the different obstacles would be surmounted, and then a laugh would be heard as one and then another would come to grief, and the question "How much further have we got to go!" would be continually asked. But all were pleased when at last the summit of the mount was reached, and a general rush made for Mrs. Murphy's, where soda and milk, lemonade, & c., were supplied to the thirsty brigade. A short rest was taken here, and many hair-breadth escapes were arrested and discussed; but all agreed that it had been enjoyable and well worth the exertion, Cr. Jones particularly so expressing himself.

While resting, two more made their appearance in the persons of Messrs. S. Armstrong, and A. Ross, who were heartily welcomed. During the journey up the Gully some splendid varieties of ferns were seen, and although the rules are strict, some could not help admiring some of the flora, one particularly finding that he had met a beautiful specimen by sitting upon it, and after an enquiry it was unanimously pronounced to be a "Scotchman." The return journey was then commenced, many preferring the road to the slippery gully, and all arrived at the camping ground about eleven o'clock, where luncheon was provided and which it is needless to say was done ample justice to. As we had a little time to spare an impromptu concert was arranged, Cr. Davies singing one of his good old songs. "Nursery rhymes" by the company, and a wrestling bout between Messrs. Armstrong and Vanstone, but as they were all over the field, it was impossible to say who won.

A move was then made to Mrs. Blair's hotel, where the party was met by several that came by a later train, amongst the number being the president, Mr. E. J. Dixon, M.L.A. Dinner was served at one o'clock in a marquee, and Mrs. Blair must be complimented on the admirable spread provided. Only one toast was proposed, viz., "The Queen", by the president.

After dinner a start was made for the cricket ground, where the first eleven of the PRAHRAN met the FERNTREE GULLY. After a good contest the GULLY team proved the victors by 20 runs; but it must be borne in mind that our cricketers were completely tired out by the morning exertion in the Gully. "Ours" made 98 runs-thanks to Renfree 29, O. Williams 10, and Farley 7 (not out). The GULLY team responded with 110 runs, of which G. Williams made 29, W. Williams 14, **R.S. Houston, of Intercolonial fame**, and Blazey 13 each.

While the game was being played, plenty of amusement in the shape of quoits, etc. was provided for the non-player. Six o'clock was the time appointed for tea, and at that hour found Mrs. Blair ready to appease the appetite and after votes of thanks to the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB, and to Mrs. Blair, the excursionists made for the station.

The return journey was of the liveliest description, thanks to Messrs. Dixon, Shevill, Jackson, and Davies, Richmond was reached at 2.30, one and all, though tired out, declaring the day to have been one of the most enjoyable outings the club has ever held.

1/2/1890 OFTG The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB ranks foremost amongst suburban clubs for the spirit with which they enter into the fine old game and the creditable performances they make. They have always a full engagement list and the following three reports give a specimen of the quality of the GULLY team. **Refer Scorebook.**

H. Williams batted in rare form for 77, C.A. [\(C.N.\)](#) Daly, 27, J.L. Wallace 25, J. Beattie 23, and FERNTREE GULLY scored 48, Calder being top scorer with 16, O.S. Williams for MALVERN took 7/16 and George J. Williams bowled best for FERNTREE GULLY.

6/2/1890 **ARGUS** SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADESMEN vs FERNTREE GULLY: this match will be played at the South Melbourne Cricket Ground today (6/2/1890), commencing at 11 o'clock. SOUTH MELBOURNE will field Chesterfield, Dobell, Evans, Lightfoot, McDonald, McInnes, Nichol, Paulin (2), Patterson and Storey

8/2/1890 **OFTG** Full detailed description (as submitted to the *Prahran Telegraph* by 'Tracker') of attendance and train trip out to Mrs. Blair's Hotel by PRAHRAN TRADESMEN and dignitaries to Ferntree Gully for the match which took place Thursday 23rd January

12/2/1890 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES: This match was played at the South Melbourne Cricket Ground (6/2/1890). The SOUTHERNERS were defeated by 21 runs. Scores: - GULLY 133, J. Fox 48 (not out), W. Williams 14, Ed Selman 14, Wallace 16, H. Williams 10, South Melbourne 112, Nichol 32, McDonald 19, Evans 14, GULLY (2nd Innings) 1/128 (G. Williams 77, Wallace 32 not out), O. Williams 5/32, E. Selman 2/5, Wallace 2/21 trundled best for the visitors. **Refer Scorebook.**

13/2/1890 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES: This match was played last Thursday (6/2/1890) on the South Melbourne Cricket Ground and after a good game the match ended in the GULLY winning by 21 runs. In the second innings of FERNTREE GULLY George Williams deserves special praise for his brilliant innings of 77 not out, his score including 6 5's, all splendid hits. In the second innings FERNTREE GULLY lost one wicket for 128 runs, G. Williams 77 not out, J. Wallace 32 not out and H. Williams 13 caught, being the scorers. **Refer Scorebook.**

FERNTREE GULLY JUNIORS vs RINGWOOD JUNIORS: This match was played last Thursday (6/2/1890) on the Ferntree Gully ground. The match ended in an easy victory by the GULLY youngsters by 10 wickets and fifteen runs, 68 & 0/45 to 37 & 61. Contributions of A. Lording (25 & 25*) and F. Selman (29 & 17*) were the best performances for the winners. Mrs. Blair, Ferntree Gully Hotel deserves a word of praise for the kind manner in which she treated the youngsters.

15/2/1890 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CLUB played the SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES on the South Melbourne Ground on February 6th. The GULLY men in their first innings made a total of 133 and in the second innings lost one wicket for 128 runs, G. Williams 77 not out and Wallace 32 not out in an unbroken 2nd Wicket Partnership of 95. The SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES in one innings made 112. **Refer Scorebook.**

The FERNTREE GULLY JUNIORS met RINGWOOD JUNIORS on February 6th at Ferntree Gully. FERNTREE GULLY in the first innings scored 68 and in the second; none for 45. RINGWOOD first innings 37, second innings 61

19/2/1890 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH YARRA WESLEYS: Last Saturday (15/2/1890) this match was played on the ground of the former. The WESLEYS were the first to bat but could do nothing with the bowling of the locals, the innings closing for 61 runs. H. Watsford 25 Not out, Ellis 11 being the only double figures. With only three quarters of an hour to play the GULLYITES started their innings and succeeded in compiling 62 runs with four wickets down. Blazey 25, Edward Selman 13, G. Williams 10, E. Lording 7 Not Out, T. Williams 5 Not Out being the principal scorers. GULLYITES won by six wickets and one run. For the winners Ed Selman got six wickets for 14, G. Williams 3 for 6, Blazey 1 for 9. **Refer Scorebook.**

20/2/1890 **DA** A very interesting match took place at Ferntree Gully on Saturday (15/2/1890) when the locals succeeded in defeating the SOUTH YARRA WESLEYANS by 6 wickets, the latter team being well represented. The visitors batted first but owing to the grand bowling of the GULLYITES they only managed to put together 61 runs when the last wicket fell. The scoring was slow as the visitors were at the wicket for over two hours. With three quarters of an hour to play and 62 runs to make to win the GULLYITES started their innings. **Refer Scorebook.**

G. Williams and E. Blazey were their first representatives and with the score on 27, Williams succumbed to a splendid ball from Freeman; Calder was next batsman but retired without scoring, being caught behind the wickets; Ed. Selman partnered Blazey and brought the score to 40 when the latter, in trying to lift a ball over the boundary was caught after having played splendidly for 25.

E. Lording was next in but lost his partner at 55, Selman being given out LBW for 13 and T. Williams and Lording then managed to bring the score to 62, three minutes before time. The visitors deserve great praise for their splendid uphill game with both their bowling and fielding being faultless.

22/2/1890 **OFTG** The SOUTH YARRA WESLEY's visited Ferntree Gully last Saturday (15/2/1890) to engage the local club, who proved too strong for them, not withstanding that they played an excellent game. The WESLEY's were disposed of for 61 of which 25 were contributed by Watsford and 11 by Ellis. The GULLY team then went to the wicket and put together 62 for the loss of four wickets, E. Blazey making 25, E. Selman 13, G. Williams 10. H.T. Calder was dismissed by being caught before scoring and E. Selman was in splendid form in his innings. **Refer Scorebook.**

26/2/1890 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY vs CLARENCE: This match was played on the ground of the former on Saturday last (22/2/1890). The GULLY was not represented by their best team, several of the players being absent. The wicket was not in very good condition, which accounts for the small scoring on both sides. The GULLY team wore crepe bands on their arms out of respect for their late [Vice President, Mr. Andrew Smith](#), he being one of the most enthusiastic supporters of the club.

The visitors were the first to bat but only succeeded in making 37, the locals replying with 51. In the 2nd Innings CLARENCE had only made 32 when the last wicket fell. With 19 runs to win the GULLYITES started their second innings and compiled 24 runs for 3 wickets leaving them winners by 7 wickets and 6 runs. T. Williams secured 5 wickets for 12 runs, Lording 3 for 10, Stevens 4 for 16 and Selman 5 for 25. **Refer Scorebook.**

27/2/1890 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs CLARENCE: This match was played on the ground of the former on Saturday last (22/2/1890). The locals were at a great disadvantage with their best players being away. Notwithstanding this the locals succeeded in winning by 7 wickets and 6 runs, the scoring of both sides being low owing to the state of the wicket. **Refer Scorebook.** The FERNTREE GULLY cricketers wore crepe bands on their arms in respect to their late and much respected [Vice President Mr. Andrew Smith](#).

5/3/1890 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY vs NORTH MELBOURNE TRADES: This match was played at Ferntree Gully on Thursday last (27/2/1890), the result being a win for NORTH MELBOURNE by 40 runs. The main feature of the game was the brilliant batting display by Blazey for 76 not out, he hitting seven fours clean over the boundary and one magnificent hit for six out of the ground. The GULLY team may well feel proud of their new acquisition; he is also a good bowler and a gun field. **Refer Scorebook.**

5/3/1890 **SPMAN** A team from NORTH MELBOURNE visited Ferntree Gully on Thursday last, and had a, very pleasant day of it. They went to endeavour to put the famous "GULLY" team through, who have hitherto, I understand, proven themselves invincible. But they in the match against the NORTHERNERS had for once to play second fiddle, the scores being - NORTH MELBOURNE, 165; FERNTREE GULLY 125. **Refer Scorebook.**

For the victors G. Bean 56, [Obscured], Franks 34, did nearly all the scoring; and for the losers, Blazey 76 not out, batted in good form, his hitting generally being very hard and clean. One stroke of his deserves special mention, for he hit a ball 132 yards, the distance being measured with a tape. During the day the visitors were most hospitably entertained and consequently thoroughly enjoyed their visit.

6/3/1890 **DA** The match between NORTH MELBOURNE TRADES and FERNTREE GULLY took place at Ferntree Gully on Thursday last (27/2/1890). The visitors had a very strong team including Houston, Bean, Chrystal, Franks, Stuckey and other well known players. G. Williams, the local skipper won the toss and elected to send the NORTH in to bat, Houston and Stuckey being their first representatives. When the score had reached 13 the former, in trying for a hit was caught in the long field by Ern Selman.

Bean was the newcomer but lost his partner, Stuckey being bowled by Ed. Selman with a curly one, the batsman being thoroughly beaten. Franks came next, the score quickly mounting up to 50 when T. Williams knocked Franks' off stump 3/50 from 24 overs. Chrystal joined Bean and the two kept their wickets in tact until lunch was taken, the board showing 3/101. After lunch the score gradually increased to 138 when Chrystal was splendidly caught by Blazey off Selman having made 40 by sound cricket.

McNee came in next to see Bean bowled by G. Williams for a sound 56 and none of the other batsmen made any runs to speak of the innings finally closing at 165. FERNTREE GULLY then proceeded to the wicket but with the exception of Blazey could do nothing against the bowling being all out for 125. The innings of Blazey 76* was by far the best seen on this ground this season, his innings including seven splendid hits over the boundary and one magnificent hit clean out of the ground for six.

His batting was faultless and on returning to the Pavilion he was greeted with loud applause by both teams. He is a great acquisition to the GULLY team as well as a fine bowler and splendid fieldsman – some say the best in the district. NORTH MELBOURNE went in for a second innings and when time was called were 7/104. This game was one of the most enjoyable the GULLY have had this season, the visitors taking victory and also enjoying themselves immensely. **Refer Scorebook.**

12/3/1890 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs ROSENTHAL ARONSON: This match was played on the ground of the former (8/3/1890) and resulted in a victory for the GULLY team by 88 runs. Scores: - ROSENTHAL ARONSON 36 (Greensil 17), FERNTREE GULLY 124; J. Lording 32, W. Dawson 29 not out, E. Selman 24, Calder 13 and Monk 13 run out for the winners batted well. Ed Selman 6/12, E. 20/3/1890 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs MALVERN: This match was played at the Gully on Saturday last (15/3/1890) and resulted in a draw greatly in favour of the GULLYITES. F. Lording (17*) and W. Dawson (16*) batted in fine style for the latter. Blazey bowled splendidly taking four of the MALVERN wickets for 34 runs, George Williams took 3 for 28. Blazey 46 not out batted in grand style. E. Blazey also bowled remarkably well as his figures will show – 8 Overs, 4 Maidens, 10 Runs and 6 Wickets. G. Williams also took four wickets and bowled well. FERNTREE GULLY, playing against PARKVIEW on Saturday last (22/3/1890) made 174 for 6 wickets while the cityites only scored 26 together. **Refer Scorebook.** At cricket and rifle shooting the Gully men are adept.

29/3/1890 **OFTG** PARKVIEW essayed the risk of lowering the flag of the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB last Saturday (22/3/1890), but they were not quite up to the task. They put together a score of 26 but it was not enough. When five wickets had fallen the score stood at 174, Calder (not out) making 74, Blazey 46 and Stevens 24.

14/5/1890 **SBMJ** Mr. Lording has on show in his window, two very handsome trophies – a claret jug and cup, for the highest scorer and best all round player in the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB. The trophies were given by two local residents.

17/5/1890 **OFTG** Two handsome trophies – a claret jug and cup presented to the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB as prizes for the highest scorer and the best all round player are on view at Mr. Lording's store

22/5/1890 **DA** A Meeting of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB was held on Thursday May 15th, Mr. Grimwood presiding in the chair. There were present Messrs Jones, Selman, Calder, Williams and **E. Lording, Secretary.**

The meeting was called to award the prize presented by Mrs. Blair of the Ferntree Gully Hotel, Messrs Moore & Abes and Greer & Co. for season 1889/90. The owners of the different prizes, when promising them to the club, left them to be awarded at the discretion of the committee.

They were given for best all round play – G. Williams, Batting – E.E. Lording, who was also presented by Mr. Calder with a trophy for services rendered to the club. **Mr. Grimwood, President,** promised the members of the club a 'smoke night' on the 12th June at Mrs. Blair's Hotel. After some routine business had been got through, the meeting closed with a vote of thanks to the President for his generosity to the members of the club. Next week I will try and send the results of the clubs matches with each member's bowling and batting averages for the past season.

Moore and Abes and Green & Co. **Mr. T.S. Grimwood, President of the Club** took the chair. Mr. G. Williams received the prize for the best all round play, and E. Lording for batting. Mr. Calder also made a presentation to Mr. Lording for valuable services to the club. The Chairman promised the club a 'Smoke Night' at Mrs. Blair's on June 12.

4/6/1890 **SBMJ** On the 12th inst. the members of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB will be entertained by the President at a social evening to be held at Mrs. Blair's hotel. What is termed a social evening is the President's Annual Dinner which is at 7:00 pm, after which the evening is spent in harmony. About 50 invitations are out, and a good house is expected, and all the members have made up their minds for a good night's enjoyment.

Next week we publish an account of the local cricket club's past performance, which includes wins against DANDENONG, SOUTH YARRA WESLEY'S, SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES, PRAHRAN TRADES and other first class clubs.

The [President](#) occupied the chair, and about 40 persons, including members of the club and visitors were present.

After the company had done justice to the sumptuous repast prepared by Mrs. Blair the following toasts were given; the Queen and the Royal family, by the President, the company signing a verse of the National Anthem. The President then proposed cricket and, in a few remarks, referred to the clubs' successes during the past, which he hoped would continue in the future.

Mr. E.L. Thompson proposed the President and spoke in high terms of Mr. Grimwood as a sportsman, who was ever to the fore in cricket, rifle shooting or any other sport which, at the Gully, would scarcely "go" without him.

Stevens, C. Young, E.H. Baker, R. Christian, E.A. Selman, E.L. Thompson, H.P. Hayward, W. Dawson, E. Blazey, Mauney and several others. A pleasant evening was brought to a close by the company signing Auld Lang Syne and the National Anthem. There is already some talk of the President giving a return dinner.

21/6/1890 **OFTG** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB and friends, were entertained on June 12th by the popular [President of the club, Mr. T.S. Grimwood](#). The entertainment took the form of a 'smoke social' and was given at Mrs. Blair's Hotel.

About 40 persons responded to the generous invitation of the President and sat down to a table laid out with that delicacy of taste and substantiality and choiceness of character which distinguishes the efforts of Mrs. Blair and her daughters in entering to such requirements. A good toast list followed on the effective attack on the edibles. The President, after the loyal toasts gave the 'FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB', in laudatory, congratulatory and encouraging terms.

Mr. E.L. Thompson, who is in his element at the festive board, gave in a happy style, 'The President', without whom there would be no sport in the Gully.

The honour was duly acknowledged, and Mr. Stevens gave 'Kindred Clubs', Dr. Showman (RINGWOOD CRICKET CLUB) and Mr. Barnes (PATTERSON, LAING & BRUCE's CRICKET CLUB) responding. Mr. Calder proposed 'The Patrons', Mr. Thompson responding and wishing the club a long career of continued prosperity. The 'Vice Presidents' was given by Mr. E.H. Baker, and acknowledged by Mr. A. Lording. Mr. T. Jones proposed 'Donors of Prizes' and Mr. E.A. Selman 'Our Visitors' to which Dr. Showman and Mr. Manney responded.
