From the **NMA Fri 9/10/1891**,

...the acquisitions are only three, but they will help do away with the 'tail' possessed last year. They are C. Armstrong and J.S. Drake of the Ormond, who are too well known to our readers to need any eulogy and E. Lording, called in football circles "farmer", who made over 1000 runs for his club last year, and had an average of 60.

This suggests that Ted Lording's season's summary (below) is at least 350 runs shy of what his actual achievements was!

Newspaper Notes

14/8/1890 **BHR** A Meeting was held at the Railway Hotel, Box Hill, on Friday evening last (8/8/1890) to consider the question of competing for a trophy in that district. The following clubs were represented, viz: SURREY HILLS, NORWOOD, DONCASTER, BLACKBURN, BOX HILL, MITCHAM, RINGWOOD AND FERNTREE GULLY. The LILYDALE and CANTERBURY clubs were not represented, though invited. Mr. Meader Jnr. was elected Chairman and after explaining the object of the Meeting, Dr. Showman proposed a motion that "the above mentioned clubs compete for a trophy during the forthcoming season", which was carried unanimously.

After considerable discussion as to forming an EASTERN DISTRICT JUNIOR CRICKET ASSOCIATION, the delegates accepted the kind offer of Mr. Bright, of this paper, to contribute a trophy of the value of £5 5/-, to be known as "THE REPORTER TROPHY". As the various clubs have not yet held their annual meetings, it was decided to adjourn until Monday 1st September 1890, when all clubs desiring to enter the competition must send their delegates and the matter be pushed on with. It is evident that considerable interest will be taken now as something has been found wanting to promote friendly rivalry amongst the clubs, and this paper is of the opinion that their offer will meet the cause.

29/8/1890 **BHR** "REPORTER TROPHY"; In order to encourage cricket in this district, the proprietors of this journal have decided to give a trophy, to be played for by the cubs in the district. In order to decide upon the conditions, the trophy will be competed for, a meeting of the delegates, two from each club, will be held at the Railway Hotel, Box Hill on Monday (1/9/1890) evening, when all the details will be arranged, it is to be hoped, in a satisfactory manner. The trophy is now vested in the hands of the delegates; therefore, it is to be hoped that all clubs in the district will be represented.

5/9/1890 **BHR** "REPORTER TROPHY"; The adjourned meeting of the delegates in connection with the above was held last Monday (1/9/1890) night at the Railway Hotel, Box Hill, Mr. W. Meader Jnr in the chair. The clubs represented were the BLACKBURN, BOX HILL, CANTERBURY, MITCHAM AND RINGWOOD. The BURWOOD club wrote stating that they will be unable to play. It was decided that each match be of two days' duration and be played on the point system. It was also decided that Mr. Jno. Toon be the hon. Secretary of the trophy committee, and that all clubs entering pay an entrance fee of 10s 6d. The sub-committee is to consist of the secretaries of the local clubs competing. The rules under which they play were agreed upon, and the final arrangements will be made on Wednesday evening next (10/9/1890) at 8 p.m. at the Railway Hotel, Box Hill, when all clubs intending to compete must be represented by their delegates.

12/9/1890 **BHR** "REPORTER TROPHY"; The delegates from the clubs intending to compete for the above trophy met at the Railway Hotel, Box Hill, on Wednesday evening last, and arranged all the preliminary details. Mr. W.K. Vail of Surrey Hills has promised a trophy of £3 3s, for the runners up. The rounds were drawn, and the matches will be played on the ground of the first mentioned club... The 1890/91 "REPORTER TROPHY" fixture, commencing on October 11th and concluding on April 18th follows

17/9/1890 **SBMJ** The return complimentary dinner tendered by members of the local cricket club to their [President, Mr. T.S. Grimwood](#), will take place this Wednesday evening at Mrs. Blair's hotel at 7:30 p.m.

18/9/1890 **DA** The **Annual General Meeting** of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB was held at Mrs. Blair's hotel on Friday evening of the 29th August – there being a good attendance. Mr. Thomas Jones occupied the chair. The balance sheet was read and showed the receipts to have been £33 8s 6d and the expenditure being £33 3s leaving a balance of 6s 6d in the hands of the [Treasurer \(H.T. Calder\)](#). The [Secretary \(E.H. Baker Jnr.\)](#) reported that the Club had played 24 matches, from which they had won 18, lost 3 and drawn 3. The following Office Bearers were elected for the coming 1890/91 season, [President: T.S. Grimwood \(re-elected\)](#), [General Committee: E.C. Blazey, H.T. Calder, G.J. Williams, H. Monk, F.N. Stevens, A.E. Selman, and E.E. Lording](#), [Match Committee: H.T. Calder, J. Lording, H. Monk, G.J. Williams, E.E. Lording](#), [Captain: George Williams](#), [Vice Captain: E. Blazey](#), [Honorary Secretary: E.E. Lording](#), [Honorary Treasurer: A.E. Selman](#).

The following have promised prizes for the coming season: Messrs. T.S. Grimwood, Alf. Lording & Thomas Jones. The Club's return dinner to the President will be held on Wednesday 17th September. A concert will also be held under the auspices of the Club on Saturday November 8. The meeting then closed with a vote of thanks for the [President, Mr. T.S. 1/10/1890 **SBMJ** The local cricket club, owing to the last train to Melbourne being taken off, are unable to arrange any matches with town clubs, which is a great disappointment to the members. I hear, however, that there is likely to be a deputation to the Commissioners to request them to take one of the other trains off instead of the late one.

4/10/1890 **OFTG** The cancellation of the last train formerly put on from the Gully to Melbourne is a serious matter to the local CRICKET CLUB, who will be greatly interfered with in arranging matches with city clubs. It is to be hoped that some way will be found to get over the difficulty.

11/10/1890 **OFTG** BLACK FLAT CRICKET CLUB proposes to journey to Ferntree Gully for the first match of the season today.

15/10/1890 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs BLACK FLAT: These clubs met on the ground of the former on Saturday. Scores: BLACK FLAT 1st Innings, 30, E. Selman 4/11, F. Stevens 5/16, bowled well. FERNTREE GULLY 1/51, E. Blazey 28 not out, and E. Lording 21 not out, were the principal scorers for the winners. **Refer Scorebook.**

16/10/1890 **DA** The FERNTREE GULLY team played their first match on Saturday against BLACK FLAT. Owing to heavy rain the wicket was in a very bad state. The BLACK FLAT went first to the wicket but was disposed of for the small score of 30. At the call of time the GULLY team had one wicket down for 51 leaving them victors by nine wickets and 21 runs. The scores included F. Stevens 5/16 and Ed. Selman 4/11 with the ball while E. Lording was 21*, G. Crack 4 and E. Blazey 25*, Sundries 1 totalling 1/51. **Refer Scorebook.**

18/10/1890 OFTG We mentioned last week that the retrenchment in the Ferntree Gully Train Service, in cancelling the 7:45 train from the Gully, would be a heavy blow to the CRICKET CLUB, as visitors would be unable to play at the Gully – there being no train to go home.

Mr. Grimwood has handled a petition to the Railway commissioners to make an alteration to this situation – a reasonable request which should be complied with. The first match of the season between BLACK FLAT and FERNTREE GULLY resulted in an easy victory for the GULLYITES. A heavy downpour of rain in the morning made the wicket very bad. BLACK FLAT was first at the wicket and was soon disposed of for just 30 runs with F. Stevens 6 Overs 5/16 and Ed. Selman 6 Overs 4/11. FERNTREE GULLY was 1/51 in reply thus winning the match by nine wickets and 21 runs.

25/10/1890 OFTG Cr. W. Chandler – a coming FERNTREE GULLY cricketer

3/11/1890 SPMAN On the Melbourne ground on Friday, Saturday and Monday next the Intercolonial Junior match Victoria v. New South Wales will be played and will doubtless prove an interesting contest. The following thirteen players have been selected, from which the Victorian team will be chosen, Messrs Collie, E. Rush, McDonald (HAWKS BURN), Kelly, McGuirk, Yates (CAPULET), Hayes (ORIENTAL), Chrystal, Stevens (ORMOND), Mailer (COBURG), Horn, (OLIVER) WILLIAMS (MALVERN), and Edwards (RICHMOND JUNIORS). I notice that Irwin and O'Shannassy, of COBURG, have been rejected. Is not this a mistake? The general opinion is that it is. I hear the Sydney team is strong in all departments of the game and will take a lot of beating. The Victorian team will be finally chosen tomorrow or Wednesday.

COBURG was defeated by MALVERN, who had four wickets to spare. G. Williams run out 23. W. Williams 19, and Furneaux 14, also played well. 14/1/1891 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs MITCHAM: This match, played on the ground of the former resulted in a win for the Gully by 101 runs. Scores: MITCHAM 62 & 3/34, FERNTREE GULLY 163 – **Refer Scorebook.**

15/1/1891 **DA** FERNTREE GULLY vs MITCHAM: Was played on the ground of the former who won by 101 runs 163 vs 62 & 3/34 – **Refer Scorebook.**

17/1/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs MITCHAM: At Ferntree Gully last Saturday (10/10/91), the result another easy win by the locals 163 to 62 & 3/34 – **Refer Scorebook.** T.S. Grimwood is to be Manager of a Ladies Team to visit England.

BLACKHILL, a new CC challenged the GULLY 15 to a match – the GULLY has not yet accepted. The GULLY Team is to be photographed on Saturday. The local barber should do a good trade during this week. Details of the establishment of a cricket club at HEATHERTON who desired to 'measure their strength with the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB'

21/1/1891 **DEXP** A number of complaints are rife over here (Ferntree Gully) at the unsatisfactory way the trains are running, as it has, I am informed, in a great measure precluded cricket teams coming from Melbourne to try conclusions with our local boys. It will be within the recollection of all that during the great strike a few of the most convenient cricket trains were discontinued and have not been put on. Now we all know that the GULLY is a great cricketing township and it seems very hard luck that through the want of sufficient railway accommodation they are debarred the company of suburban teams. A strong effort should be made by some of our influential residents to have, at least, one convenient cricketing train put on – if only every Saturday.

21/1/1891 **PTEL** PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S Annual outing to Ferntree Gully to-morrow (Thursday 22nd January 1891)

24/1/1891 **OFTG** Reports from the MITCHAM match in the 'Gully Notes' Column include – "F. Stevens had a little duck – usual luck" and "MITCHAM's bowling rather lofty and easily dealt with".

28/1/1891 **DEXP** CRICKET, FERNTREE GULLY vs PRAHRAN TRADES: This match was played at the Gully on Thursday last (22/1/1891), the result being a decisive victory for the locals by 7 wickets and 16 runs – **Refer Scorebook**. FERNTREE GULLY vs BALACLAVA ROVERS; The above match, which was played at the Gully on Saturday last (24/1/1891), resulted in a draw. The home team were the first to bat, and at the close of the day's play had compiled the grand total of 236 for the loss of 7 wickets – **Refer Scorebook**. The Secretary of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB informs us that he would like to arrange matches with the DANDENONG, BERWICK, or any team in the district, on the Gully ground for a dinner or trophy.

28/1/1891 **PTEL** PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S TRIP TO FERNTREE GULLY – The annual trip of the PRAHRAN TRADESMEN'S CLUB to Ferntree Gully on Thursday last must be placed with the most successful outings that the club have held, the weather being almost perfect. About 30 members left the Prahran station at 7 a.m. and were joined by about 20 more at the Richmond station.

As the 7.20 train steamed into the station two carriages that had been set apart for the excursionists were taken possession of, and hardly had the train started before the fun commenced, newspapers being used as batons, and cushions as barricades, Reuben Jackson making things very lively.

On the arrival at the Upper Ferntree Gully station a move was made for the camping ground by those who intended to make the ascent of the gully, those remaining at the foot taking care of the coats, etc., cards and other games occupying the time. After a toilsome journey up the gully a sigh of relief was given when the top was reached, and a rush was made for Mr. Murphy's, whose soda and milk proved very refreshing; a rest was now taken, and on the return to the foot of the gully a very nice luncheon was done justice to.

A move was then made to Mr. Blair's hotel, where the party was met by the president, Mr. E. J. Dixon, M.P., and others, who had arrived by a later train. Games were indulged in until the welcome sound of the dinner bell was heard. The dinner was served in a large marquee erected at the side of the hotel, and Mrs. Blair must be highly complimented on the manner in which she carried out the arrangements, everything being of the best.

After the inner man had been served, the event of the day took place — viz., a cricket match against the FERNTREE GULLY C.C.; but whether from the morning's exertions, or the dinner, our own had to succumb to the local contingent. The TRADES made a total of 105 runs, of which only C. Daly (37) and A. Coventry (34) could stand the deadly bowling of E. Lording, who, in one over, took three wickets for one run. The GULLY, at the call of time, had only 3 wickets down for 120 runs, Blazey of the local team making a score of 62 before being disposed of.

BALACLAVA ROVERS vs FERNTREE GULLY: The match between these clubs on Saturday ended in a draw. The GULLY remained at the wickets all day and lost 7 wickets for 236.

28/1/1891 **SBMJ** BALACLAVA ROVERS vs FERNTREE GULLY: This match was played last Saturday at the Gully. The local team batted first and remained at the wickets all afternoon. **Refer Scorebook**. The GULLY team have a splendid record for the last 12 matches, 8 being won, 1 lost and 3 drawn all greatly in favour of the local team.

Some splendid innings have been played, notably 3 wickets for 100 runs against RICHMOND 2nd XI, 5 for 110 against RAMBLERS (SOUTH MELBOURNE), 3 for 214 against ST. VINCENT, 2 for 153 against BOHEMIANS, 2 for 121 against PRAHRAN TRADES, 7 for 236 against BALACLAVA ROVERS.

Both in batting and bowling some remarkably good averages were made. Tomorrow the FERNTREE GULLY and SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES play on the South Melbourne Ground and on Saturday the GULLY Team play the VICTORIAN RAILWAYS at the Gully.

Some splendid innings have been played, notably 3/100 against RICHMOND 2nd XI, 5/110 against RAMBLERS, 3/214 against ST. VINCENT, 2/153 against BOHEMIANS, 2/121 vs PRAHRAN TRADES, 7/236 vs BALACLAVA ROVERS. Both in batting and bowling some remarkably good averages have been made. Today the GULLY team plays VICTORIAN RAILWAYS at the Gully. Is OAKLEIGH going to tackle FERNTREE GULLY this season?

31/1/1891 **AGE** CRICKET; SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES v. FERNTREE GULLY, at S.M.C.G. resulted in a win for the GULLY on the first innings by 49 runs. Scores: GULLY 149. G. Williams, 75, McInnes securing eight wickets for 65 runs. SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES, 100 in the first Innings and 113 for four wickets in the second, Dobell 34 (not out), Baragwanath 15, Windley 15 and Steele 14 in the first innings and T. Paulin 30 (not out), McInnes 28, G. Paulin 25 in the second innings. O. Williams and F. Lording bowled well for the GULLY, securing four and three wickets respectively. **Refer Scorebook.**

4/2/1891 **DEXP** CRICKET, FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES: The GULLY team journeyed to South Melbourne on Thursday last (29/1/1891) and succeeded in scoring a win against the SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES – **Refer Scorebook.** FERNTREE GULLY vs VICTORIAN RAILWAYS: These teams met on the ground of the former on Saturday last (31/1/1891), the visitors being rather easily defeated by 8 wickets and 80 runs – **Refer Scorebook.**

It was stated in the last issue that the FERNTREE GULLY C.C. were desirous of playing a match against some local club for a dinner. There is some talk of the DANDENONG C.C. accepting the challenge.

4/2/1891 **SBMJ** The FERNTREE GULLY journeyed to South Melbourne on Thursday last to play the local TRADES. The latter were first to bat, the innings closing for 100. O. Williams and F. Lording bowled well. The GULLYITES compiled 149, G. Williams 75, E. Lording 18, O. Williams not out 17, the GULLY team thus winning by 49 runs. The SOUTH had lost 5 wickets for 104 in their second innings when time was called. **Refer Scorebook.**

7/2/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs SOUTH MELBOURNE TRADES: This match was played on the South Melbourne Cricket Ground on Thursday last (5/2/91) the result being a win for the GULLY team by 49 runs – **Refer Scorebook.** SOUTH MELBOURNE versus the GULLY the former being dismissed for just 101. G. Williams stunned the locals by sending the ball to the boundary every time, once over the pavilion. E. Lording did some excellent bowling and F. Stevens completely mastered the grubbers in a pleasant outing. FERNTREE GULLY vs VICTORIAN RAILWAYS, on Saturday last the GULLY team met the RAILWAYS and won by 8 wickets and 80 runs 2/135 to 55 – **Refer Scorebook.**

11/2/1891 **DEXP** TSG (Thomas Samuel Grimwood) was jubilant over the GULLY CC victory last Saturday

The Black Hill architect importing a team of learned cricketers to play the GULLY boys; I guess they will want a lot of schooling.

FERNTREE GULLY vs WEBB & SONS: The teams met on the ground of the former on Saturday last (7/2/1891). E. Blazey and E. Lording were the first representatives of the home team, but as the score had reached 123 without a separation being effected the GULLY skipper declared his innings closed, Blazey having scored 74* and Lording 48*. At the call of time WEBB's team had lost 3 wickets for 62, the match ending in a draw. The bowling of the visiting team was very good though not destructive; while F. Stevens bowled splendidly for the home team, taking 3 wickets for 2 runs. **Refer Scorebook.**

11/2/1891 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY vs WEBB & SONS EMPLOYEES: **Refer Scorebook.**

11/2/1891 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs WEBB & SONS: The FERNTREE GULLY went to the wickets first and Blazey and E. Lording, the first men in, remained there until they had rattled up 123 runs, when the innings was declared closed. The former made 74 and the latter 48. WEBB & SONS lost three wickets for 62; Purves 32 not out, P. Harper 27 not out, being the most successful batsmen. F. Stevens took the three wickets for 2 runs. **Refer Scorebook.**

13/2/1891 **BHR** Tomorrow (Saturday) afternoon the UNION JACK C.C. journey to Ferntree Gully to play the FERNTREE GULLY 2nd ELEVEN. The following are requested to meet on the Box Hill Station at 2 p.m. sharp – Aspinall, Barton, Clark, Carey, Blackburn (2), Cotter, Hodges (2), Hansen, Munro, Plaisted, Pope, F. Sweetland, Williams and Luke

14/2/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs WEBB & SONS EMPLOYEES: This match was played on the formers ground ending in a draw greatly in favour of the GULLY 0/123 to 3/62 – **Refer Scorebook.**

18/2/1891 **DEXP** The FERNTREE boys met a team from ROSENTHAL & ARONSON on their own ground on Saturday last (14/2/1891), the locals winning the match by 6 wickets and 32 runs. In the first innings the visiting team only put together the remarkably low score of 58 runs. F. Lording taking 5 wickets for 3 runs, G. Williams 3 wickets for 11 runs and Stevens 2 wickets for 22 runs. The FERNTREE GULLY team lost four wickets for 90 runs. George Williams 59 batted well for the GULLYITES, who no doubt put the opposition through without much difficulty. **Refer Scorebook.**

18/2/1891 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY v. ROSENTHAL ARONSON: This match was played on the ground of the former on Saturday and won by the Gully team by 6 wickets and 32 runs – **Refer Scorebook.**

20/2/1891 **BHR** Last Saturday (14/2/1891) the UNION JACK club travelled to Ferntree Gully to play the FERNTREE GULLY JUNIORS. The JUNIORS were the first to bat, but made no stand, being all disposed of for 32 runs. The JACKS then went to the wickets and owing to the splendid hitting powers displayed by Aspinall, who racked up 41 (not out) in a short time, they defeated their opponents by seven wickets and 43 runs.

21/2/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs ROSENTHAL, ARONSON & CO: The return match between these teams was played last Saturday (14/2/91) at the Gully, with the GULLY winning very easily by 6 wickets and 32 runs – 4/90 to 58. The local team up until the present time have played 21 matches, Won 12, Lost 3 and Drawn 6, of which 5 were greatly in their favour – **Refer Scorebook.**

25/2/1891 **DEXP** A team of English cricketers is to visit Australia next season under the direction of Lord Sheffield.

A cricket match was played between FERNTREE GULLY and BLACK FLAT on Saturday last (21/2/1891) and resulted in an easy win for the GULLY boys by 7 wickets and 30 runs. The FERNTREE boys are to the front again. **Refer Scorebook.**

25/2/1891 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY v. BLACK FLAT; This match was played on the ground of the latter. The GULLYITES won by 7 wickets and 3 runs. The wicket was in a terrible condition, which, no doubt, accounts for the poor scoring. No accidents of a serious nature occurred during the match – **Refer Scorebook.**

28/2/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs BLACK FLAT: This match took place on Saturday last (21/2/91) at Black Flat, resulting in a win for the GULLY team by 7 wickets and 30 runs – 44 & 3/37 to 25 & 26. The wicket was in very bad order, the bowling being almost unplayable. This accounts for the low scores on both sides. The winner's batted one man short – **Refer Scorebook.** A good program of Sports is to be held on Easter Monday on the local cricket ground. Entries are being taken for the Shire Handicap (local) 100 yd's, 200 yd's, 300 yd's, 400 yd's, and Hurdle 174 yards. Entries close on 14th March and may be obtained from Mr. A. Lording's Store and Mrs. Blair's Hotel.

4/3/1891 **DEXP** T.S. Grimwood convalescent; FERNTREE GULLY cricketers again on the winning side last Saturday (28/2/1891)

On Saturday (28/2/1891) the GULLY cricketers met a team from SARGOOD, BUTLER & NICHOL, but the latter made a very poor stand against the formidable GULLYITES, the local boys winning easily by 7 wickets and 44 runs. The opposing team only made 59 runs all told. E. Lording captured 6 wickets for 17 runs and F.A. (Possibly incorrect second initial) Stevens 3 wickets for 41 runs. FERNTREE GULLY had lost 3 wickets for 103 runs when time was called, the principle scorers being E. Lording 54 not out, G. Williams 31, J. Charman11. **Refer Scorebook.**

On Saturday next (7/3/1891) the FERNTREE GULLY team play SOUTH MELBOURNE RAMBLERS and a close game is expected, the latter being a very strong team. **Ferntree Gully Crumbs:** A copper full of stewed pears are prepared for G. Williams; Calder won the match BLACK FLAT vs FERNTREE GULLY; splendid batting, Stevens got 5 wickets for 9 runs; Henry Monk performed the Hat Trick and excellent fielding by T. Jones. Five to One laid freely on the FERNTREE GULLY team – Brooks says he has 25 of the UNIVERSITY to pick from.

4/3/1891 **SPMAN** FERNTREE GULLY vs SARGOOD, BUTLER & NICHOL: These clubs met on the ground of the former on Saturday. Scores: SARGOOD's 59 (Propsting 18, Letcher 8, E. Lording 6/17, F. Stevens 3/41). FERNTREE GULLY 3/103 (E. Lording 54 not out, G. Williams 31), Andrews & Letcher bowled well for the losers. **Refer Scorebook.**

4/3/1891 **SBMJ** A match was played between FERNTREE GULLY and a team from SARGOOD, BUTLER & NICHOL – **Refer Scorebook.**

7/3/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs SARGOOD, BUTLER & NICHOL: This match was played at the Gully on Saturday last (28/2/91), resulting in a very easy win for the GULLY by 7 Wickets and 44 runs, 3/103 to 59 – **Refer Scorebook.**

11/3/1891 **SBMJ** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB enjoyed a walkover on Saturday last, the RAMBLERS not putting in an appearance. The **Secretary (E.E. Lording)** of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB begs to acknowledge cheque for £1 1s from E.L. Thompson, Esq.

18/3/1891 **DEXP** FERNTREE GULLY vs LANSDOWNE: This match was played at the Gully on Saturday last (14/3/1891). The visitors were the first to bat and scored 97 runs before the last wicket fell. The GULLY team compiled 174 runs for 3 wickets. The scoring was very rapid, the locals being at the wicket for an hour and 20 minutes only – **Refer Scorebook.**

So far, the FERNTREE GULLY club have played 24 matches this season, of which they have won 15, drawn 6, lost 3, 5 of the draws being in their favour and 1 against.

The batting averages up to date are as follows: E. Lording 22 Innings, 12 not outs, 652 runs at Ave 65.2, E. Blazey 16 Innings, 6 not outs, 553 runs at Ave 55.3, G. Williams 19 Innings, 2 not outs, 592 runs at Ave 34.14, F. Lording 15 Innings, 4 not outs, 222 runs at Ave 20.2, H. Calder 15 Innings, 3 not outs, 227 runs at Ave 19.0. E. Blazey, E. Lording, F. Stevens, G. Williams, F. Lording are foremost in bowling averages respectively.

18/3/1891 **SBMJ** FERNTREE GULLY vs LANSDOWNE: This match was played on the ground of the former on Saturday last, the GULLYITES winning by seven wickets and 77 runs – **Refer Scorebook.**

21/3/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs LANSDOWNE: Took place at the Gully. The Visitors were the first to bat making 97. At the call of time the GULLYITES had made 3/174, the scoring being very fast, they making the score in 1 hour and 20 mins! – **Refer Scorebook.**

25/3/1891 **DEXP** Ferntree Gully Crumbs: On Good Friday (27/3/1891) the GULLY cricketers meet the HAWKS BURN boys on the local ground, when a good game is expected.

On Saturday next, the GULLY team meet AVENUES. Two old faces turned up suddenly last week – Harry Moon from Kajuligah, New South Wales and Jim Lording, from Western Australia. Both are in good form with the bat and ball. The GULLY team will be strengthened considerably by their inclusion.

1/4/1891 **DEXP** FERNTREE GULLY vs HAWKS BURN: The above clubs met at Ferntree Gully on Saturday last (28/3/1891), the latter winning easily by 3 wickets and 202 runs – **Refer Scorebook.**

1/4/1891 **SPMAN** On Saturday I had a chat with a couple of the Messrs Williams, of MALVERN CRICKET CLUB fame. I learnt that there are six brothers (**Henry Thomas died in a tragic cart accident in 1892**). Three of them play for MALVERN, the others for FERNTREE GULLY. They average 6 ft. 1 in. in height, and in weight they average 13 stone. I was relieved when I also learnt they are very quiet. **"They are probably the best respected cricketing brothers in all Melbourne cricket".**

4/4/1891 **PTEL** The HAWKS BURN had a pleasant day at Ferntree Gully on Good Friday, the GULLY boys having to play second fiddle to the visitors. Lockett and Taylor both made good scores. **Refer Scorebook.**

4/4/1891 **OFTG** FERNTREE GULLY vs HAWKS BURN: Played at Ferntree Gully the result being an easy win for the visitors by 3 wickets and 202 runs. **Refer Scorebook.**

Scores included J. Charman 20, F. Lording 3, E. Lording 16, G. Williams 9, H.T. Calder 3, J. Lording 2, H. Monk 13, T. Williams 0, Ern Selman 4, F. Stevens 5, E. Blazey Absent, Sundries 11 – All out 86, HAWKSBURN 7/288 – F. Stevens 72 Balls 3/53, E. Lording 84 Balls 2/41, Ern Selman 36 Balls 1/33 the pick of the GULLY Bowlers. Bowling for HAWKSBURN was noted Australian Test player Sid Gregory who took 7 of the 9 wickets to fall (E. Blazey was absent due to illness). **Refer Scorebook.**

13/5/1891 **DEXP** **FTGFC** Mr. E.E. Lording, the popular footballer and cricketer, has left the Gully, and gone to reside at North Melbourne. The footballers of that place valued his worth so highly that they purchased a hairdressing and tobacconists' business for him, and he is one of the leading members of their club.

Ted will be greatly missed from the Gully, as he was always to the fore in sporting matters, or anything else to further the welfare of the place. Should any of the GULLYITES, when in Melbourne, wish to make themselves presentable, or desire a good weed, they should call at 74 Errol Street, North Melbourne.
