The number of matches played during the season was **19, of which 11 were won, 1 lost and 7 drawn**. FERNTREE GULLY scored 2987 runs in the season losing 111 wickets at an average of 269 per innings.

The opposing teams scored 1261 runs for the loss of 159 wickets at an average of 79 runs per innings, which is a wonderful record on the part of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB.

This infers that the 12 matches either abandoned or where the result is record as unknown were not played and therefore no results exist.

From the **Maffra Spectator** (11/6/1894) *Mr. E.E. Lording of Ferntree Gully Cricket Club last season, played in 16 matches, was not out nine times, his highest score was 105 not out, his aggregate number of runs for the season was 635 and his batting average 90.7. This would take a lot of beating in the colony.*

From the **Herald** (15/12/1893) *An extraordinary batting average is in course of competition by a FERN TREE GULLY cricketer - Lording, of North Melbourne football fame. His scores are given in this week's "Sportsman" as follow 32 not out, 36 caught, 64 not out, 47 not out, 60 not out, 52 not out and 105 not out – seven innings, average 396. He has made 328 since he lost his wicket. FERNTREE GULLY, and other outside grounds, don't usually conduce to tri-century averages. Are you there selection committee? Does this phenomenal record tempt you to make an opportunity of seeing Lording shape?*

15/9/1893 **BHR** Correspondence received from [E.E. Lording \(Secretary FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB\)](#) asking for the free use of the new Shire Hall for the purpose of holding a concert and ball in aid of the funds of the club on the first available date after the opening and asking the support of the council. The matter will be considered at a future date.

20/9/1893 **DEXP** The "toe ball" season has about closed, and cricket will soon be in full "swing." Our knights of the willow over here expect to have a good innings during the coming season.

27/9/1893 **DEXP** The FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB has decided to compete for the EASTERN DISTRICT TROPHY, and they should give a good account of themselves if they put their best team into the field. Mr. J.S. Crawford and Mr. Ed. Selman were appointed Delegates to attend the meeting at Surrey Hills for the purpose of making arrangements.

A cricket match has been arranged which should be very interesting to be played on the Melbourne Cricket Ground between the M.C.C. and a combined 15 of the MORNINGTON COUNTY on October 25th and 26th. If it is possible to get the best players of the following clubs to take part in the match viz., DANDENONG, BERWICK, MORNINGTON, CRANBOURNE, NARRE WARREN RAILWAYS, MORDIALLOC and FERNTREE GULLY, a very close game might be expected, and I think the county players might come off victorious. I am informed that every effort will be made to get the best representative team together, and by the different clubs in the county working together the match should be a success.

1/11/1893 **DEXP** MELBOURNE CRICKET CLUB vs MORNINGTON COUNTY: A fairly representative team of this county played in the above match last Wednesday (25/10/1893) on the Melbourne Cricket Ground, the result being an easy victory for the host team (who put a very strong team into the field), by 7 wickets and 18 runs. DANDENONG vs FERNTREE GULLY was played at Dandenong on Saturday last (3/3/1894). - In the next match the local team occupied the crease all day against MELBOURNE scoring 8 wickets for 176, E. Lording (64 not out), E.D. Selman (41), J. Lording (25) and W. Williams (21) were the principal scorers.

- A strong COMBINED TRAMWAYS team was the next match. The TRAMWAYS batted first and made 144 runs, Blazey (2 for 11) and F. Lording (5 for 47) divided the bowling honors. The GULLY boys had just made the required runs when time was called, the locals winning by 5 wickets and 1 run, E. Lording (43 not out), F. Lording (37), Blazey (30) and M. Doyle (12) were the principal scorers
- The TWENTY CLUB were all disposed of for the small score of 24 runs, E. Lording took 5 wickets for 5, J. Lording 2 for 3, E.D. Selman 1 for 7 and Blazey 1 for 10. The GULLYITES had made 146 for the loss of 7 wickets when stumps were drawn, J. Lording (83 not out), F. Lording (18 not out), E.D. Selman (18) and Blazey (17) batted in good style.
- The following Saturday the GULLY team journeyed to Ringwood and played the local team and won easily by 2 wickets and 92 runs. RINGWOOD scored 76, F. Lording (6 wickets for 29), and J. Lording (2 for 1). FERNTREE GULLY made 168 for the loss of 8 wickets, G. Williams (64), and M. Doyle (50 not out) batted well.
- ALFRED SHAW's team was the next engagement and they made 47. G. Williams took 3 for 6, J. Lording 1 for 0, F. Lording 4 for 27, and Blazey 2 for 15. FERNTREE GULLY had 4 wickets down for 142, M. Doyle (44 not out), W. Williams (38), E. Lording (21 not out) and Crawford (20) batted best for the home team, the GULLYITES thus winning by 7 wickets and 95 runs.
- BLACKBURN had a trip to the Gully on the Saturday following, and were welcomed with an afternoons leather hunting, the GULLY boys making 263 for the loss of 9 wickets, J. Lording (51), Blazey (39), G. Williams (38), A. Lording (34 not out), Crawford (27), E. Selman (21) and W. Williams (21) were in good form.
- The principle match of the season took place on the next Saturday against DANDENONG, on the ground of the latter. Great interest was manifested in the game, which unluckily for the GULLY players terminated in a draw, time being called at a critical part of the game, when victory seemed a certainty for the GULLYITES. DANDENONG batted first and made 142 of which R. Keys made 62 and T. Orgill 32. F. Stevens (4 for 19) and E. Lording (4 for 30) divided the honors in bowling. FERNTREE GULLY had lost 6 wickets for 119 runs; E. Lording (45 not out), W. Williams (15), G. Williams (12), J. Lording (12) and F. Lording (11) were the principle scorers.

- The return match with BOHEMIA resulted in a draw in favour of the local team when they compile 97, J. Lording (3 for 15), E. Lording (3 for 18), Stevens (2 for 14) and G. Williams (1 for 19). FERNTREE GULLY had 6 wickets down for 79 runs, E. Blazey (35) and W. Williams (11 not out) being the scorers.
- The final match of the season against XVIII of MACCLESFIELD and GEMBROOK, produced a very large score on the part of the GULLY team who scored 383 runs for 8 wickets, G. Williams (109), E. Lording (87), E. Blazey (67 not out), F. Lording (33), W. Williams (29), Stevens (19 not out), and J. Lording (14). The combined teams had lost 12 wickets for 106 when time was called; J. Lording secured 6 wickets for 11, F. Stevens 2 for 17 and G. Williams 2 for 25.

The number of matches played during the season was 19, of which 11 were won, 1 lost and 7 drawn. FERNTREE GULLY scored 2987 runs in the season losing 111 wickets at an average of 269 per innings. The opposing teams scored 1261 runs for the loss of 159 wickets at an average of 79 runs per innings, which is a wonderful record on the part of the FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB.

During the season the club has had to contend with great difficulties financially, the membership decreasing from 37 to 22. Notwithstanding this the clubs committee has succeeded in diminishing the debit balance for the previous year.

The club also held a concert at the Shire Hall, which is said to have been the best entertainment to have ever been held in the district, after which a most enjoyable dance was held, invitations being issued by the club, and this was also well attended. The result of the concert financially was a great success.

The following gentlemen are deserving of thanks for augmenting the funds of the club – Mr. H.R. Moore £1 1s, Cr. R.H. Kerr 10s 6d, Cr. Dobson 10s 6d, Dr. D. Simpson 10s 6d, also the donation of a prize for the highest individual score in a match to have been presented by Mr. R. Dudgeon, which was won by J. Lording with 116 not out. A word of thanks is also due to T.S. Grimwood, president of the club, for the use of the playing ground.

11/6/1894 **MAFF** Mr. E.E. Lording of FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB last season, played in 16 matches, was not out nine times, his highest score was 105 not out, his **aggregate number of runs for the season was 635 and his batting average 90.7.** This would take a lot of beating in the colony.
