25/9/1895 SBMJ Letter to the editor from "Disinterested" lamenting the lack of an organised Competition, centred around Dandenong that could include Berwick, Narre Warren and FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB's among others to ensure better local competition.

<u>25/9/1895</u> DEXP Letter to editor also recorded (as above)

12/10/1895 ARGUS Passed Away - On the 11th inst. At his residence, Lower Ferntree Gully, Thomas Samuel Grimwood J.P. of Suffolk England, Aged 71 years, a colonist of 44 years.

15/10/1895 SPMAN On Friday (11/10/1895), at Ferntree Gully, there died, aged 71, Mr. Thomas S. Grimwood. A colonist of over 44 years, deceased was originally a large contractor, among other contracts being that for the catering, for the principal volunteer encampments. In sporting circles, be was well known as an enthusiastic patron of the gun. He was himself an excellent shot and included among his records many victories in pigeon matches, in which he gained valuable trophies. His principal match was that with Mr. Redwood, of New Zealand, for £100 a-side, which be won. He was also president of the Rifle Association and of the FERNTREE (GULLY) CRICKET CLUB. Early in the seventies the deceased gentleman was proprietor of the Rose, Thistle and Shamrock Hotel, in Elizabeth-street, well known us the resort of our principal racing and other sporting folk.

The funeral took place on Sunday, and was largely attended, the cortege including members of the Rifle Association and of the local cricket club. The deceased leaves a family, his eldest son being "Mr. Sam" Grimwood, also intimately known in all-round sporting circles.

16/10/1895 DEXP Death of Mr. Thomas S. Grimwood JP, twice married with 11 children to his first wife and 7 to his second, while serving on the board of the local School, Cemetery Trust, RECREATION RESERVE TRUSTEE, Captain of the Rifle Club and one time host of the Ferntree Gully Hotel, centre of the districts sporting excellence and regular stop for the visiting excursionists of the district.

16/10/1895 SBMJ Matches against the DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB will be played by FERNTREE GULLY on Dec 14th at Ferntree Gully and January 25th at Dandenong

17/10/1895 DA FERNTREE GULLY loses a good cricketing man in Crawford who has left the club in an awful hurry. Warrants have been issued for his arrest. The DANDENONG CRICKET CLUB draw includes games against FERNTREE GULLY on 14/12/1895 at the Gully, and 25/1/1896 at Dandenong.

19/10/1895 OFTG The Funeral of the late Mr. T.S. Grimwood J.P. took place Sunday 13th October and was very well attended by all in the district. The Rifle Club, of which the deceased was Captain, and the CRICKET CLUB, headed the procession to the local cemetery. Father Malone, of Dandenong conducted the service and wreathes, crosses and floral emblems were sent in great proliferation in memory of a man whose deeds as a servant of the community are too many to mention.

6/11/1895 DEXP FERNTREE GULLY played their first match of the season last Saturday (2/11/1895) against BLACK FLAT and won by 35 runs. The scoring was very poor owing to the wicket not having been prepared – **Refer Scorebook.** FERNTREE GULLY play UNIVERSITY next Saturday 9th inst on the ground of the former.

A good deal of surprise was felt, when it became known on Sunday, that Crawford, our defaulting Shire Secretary, had been arrested on board the boat at Capetown, as very few believed he had actually taken flight in the vessel. The Council Meeting on Monday was postponed until Wednesday as several members had to go to town to sign the extradition warrant to have him brought back. He will not appear in the Gully Court as the cheques were cashed in Melbourne.

7/11/1895 DA BLACK FLAT played FERNTREE GULLY at Ferntree Gully on Saturday last which resulted in a win for the locals by 35 Runs. The wicket was in a very bad state, which accounts for the low scoring of both teams – Scores detailed below. FERNTREE GULLY plays UNIVERSITY on Saturday 9th at the ground of the former.

9/11/1895 OFTG BLACK FLAT played FERNTREE GULLY on Saturday last which resulted in a victory for the locals on an undesirable wicket by 69 runs to 36. The scorers for the locals were W. Williams 0, W. Anderson 3, G. Selman 2, A. Lording 32, W. Simmons 0, E. McGuigan 0, H. King 0, G. Jackson 3, F. Lording 18, E. Lording 11, F. Stevens 0, Sundries 1 totalling 69 while with the ball F. Stevens 7/15, F. Lording 3/11 and E. Lording 2 caught were the achievers.

12/11/1895 AGE CRICKET; UNIVERSITY v. FERNTREE GULLY was played on Saturday at Ferntree Gully, and resulted in a win for the UNIVERSITY on the first innings by 52 runs. Scores: UNIVERSITY, 139 (Love 45, Quirk 25, Lewis 24, MacDonald 15, Crespin 14); FERNTREE GULLY, 87 (A. Lording 44). N.O. Lewis, five wickets for 37 and MacDonald, five for 43, did the bowling for the University.

13/11/1895 DEXP FERNTREE GULLY played UNIVERSITY at the Gully last Saturday (9th inst), the visitors winning by 49 runs. Scores GULLY 88, A. Lording 46 not out, UNIVERSITY 137; Love 46, Quick 25, Lewis 24, McDonald 18, Crespin 14, F. Stevens took 4 wickets for 57 runs, G. Williams 1 for 7, E. Lording 1 for 21 and E. McGuigan 1 for 34. FERNTREE GULLY play BAYSWATER next Saturday, 16th inst, on the ground of the latter.

14/11/1895 DA The UNIVERSITY team journeyed to Ferntree Gully last Saturday and played the locals who were defeated by 52 runs. The totals were UNIVERSITY 139, FERNTREE GULLY 87 of which A. Lording made 44.

20/11/1895 DEXP FERNTREE GULLY played BAYSWATER with a very weak team last Saturday (16/11/1895), only four of the club turning up to play. The team was made up of six substitutes and played one man short. BAYSWATER won by 33 runs, the scores being BAYSWATER 102 def FERNTREE GULLY 69. The match was played at Bayswater

18/12/1895 DEXP DANDENONG played FERNTREE GULLY on Saturday last (14/12/1895) at the Gully, the match ending in a draw – Refer Scorebook. FERNTREE GULLY plays MACCLESFIELD next Saturday (21/12/1895) at the Gully.

18/12/1895 SBMJ The DANDENONG and FERNTREE GULLY teams met on Saturday last. It was arranged that each team should bat for an hour and a half, and the result was: DANDENONG 5/104 to FERNTREE GULLY 5/140.

19/12/1895 DA The DANDENONG club has secured the services of a good player in McGuigan who took 2 catches, 2 wickets and made 23 runs in his game against his old team for whom he played two matches this season. Many a rumour abounds about his prior cricketing talents, which were believed to have been demonstrated at HAWTHORN. If the rumour mill is correct, he is believed to have been appointed Captain of that club so is indeed a welcome inclusion to the DANDENONG club.

The bowling efforts for the locals were achieved by M. Doyle 2, F. Stevens 1, G. Williams 1, E. Lording 1 & 1c, while catches went to G. Selman 2. Batting honours for FERNTREE GULLY went to W. The scorers for FERNTREE GULLY were Doyle 0, G. Williams 26, A. Lording 69, J. Doyle 74*, E. Lording 10, W. Williams 41*, Sundries 13 totalling 4/239.

Blazey, late of the FERNTREE GULLY CLUB made a splendid 80 in excellent style in his first innings for RICHMOND last Saturday in their match against the CAPULET's in the Boyle and Scott's Cup Final match. This was not enough to give RICHMOND the lead who failed by 30 runs to pass the 228 set by the CAPS'.

6/5/1896 DEXP The FERNTREE GULLYCRICKET CLUB intend holding a Grand Ball in the Shire Hall on Monday evening, 25th Inst.

NOTE: An advertisement to the effect was also placed in the Dandenong Express, with G. Williams signing off as Hon Sec. It is uncertain at this time (2019) if George was Secretary of the Ball Committee or the Cricket Club for the 1895/96 season, but the latter seems quite likely.

20/5/1896 DEXP We would again remind those who find pleasure in the light fantastic that the FERNTREE GULLYCRICKET CLUB will hold a Grand Ball in the Shire Hall on Monday evening next, 25th Inst.

20/5/1896 SBMJ Correspondence received at Shire of Ferntree Gully from George Williams, Hon. Secretary FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB, asking for use of the hall for the annual ball on behalf of the club on 25th May, and urging a reduction in the rental

On the motion of the President and Cr. Jones the request was complied with and the rent reduced from 30s to 15s, providing that the hall was cleaned up in time to hold the court the next day.

27/5/1896 DEXP FERNTREE GULLY CRICKET CLUB: The Ball held in the Shire Hall last Monday evening in connection with the cricket club was fairly well attended, and all present seemed to greatly enjoy themselves. It was not a big financial success, but the club will probably have small surplus after paying expenses.
