1901/02 EASTERN DISTRICT TROPHY COMPETITION COMMENCES ITS SECOND SEASON

<u>7/9/1899</u> ARGUS Thursday, FERNTREE GULLY CLUB – This club is open to accept engagements with any metropolitan or suburban clubs on holidays or Saturday afternoons. Address, Secretary (<i>Possibly Ted McGuigan</i>), care of Royal Hotel, Upper Ferntree Gully
<u>7/9/1899 HER</u> The FERNTREE GULLY CLUB is open to accept engagements with any metropolitan or suburban clubs that may have vacancies on holidays or Saturday afternoons. The secretary's address is care of Royal Hotel, Upper Ferntree Gully.
15/9/1899 BHR EASTERN DISTRICT TROPHY COMPETITION; A Meeting of delegates from clubs interested in forming this competition for the 1899/1900 cricket season (Second season) was held in the Recreation Hall in Box Hill on Wednesday night (13/9) Representatives of two proposed new clubs – KEW and FERNTREE GULLY were also in attendance. It was decided to admit KEW to the competition but that the admittance of FERNTREE GULLY be denied as their ground was outside the boundaries of the competition and the ground was too far away. The FERNTREE GULLY delegate expressed disappointment on behalf of his club but understood the delegates ruling.
19/9/1899 AGE CRICKET; EASTERN DISTRICT TROPHY COMPETITION - At a meeting held at the Recreation Hall, Box Hill, of delegates from clubs comprising the EASTERN DISTRICT CRICKET ASSOCIATION, it was decided to have another trophy competition for the coming season. Mr. J. Steele was elected president, and Mr. P. W. Plaisted hon. secretary of the association Applications from the KEW and FERNTREE GULLY CLUBS were received, and it was decided not to allow them to join the association Clubs entered are as follow: - BOX HILL, CANTERBURY, SURREY HILLS, BURWOOD, DONCASTER, EAST BURWOOD CAMBERWELL AND RINGWOOD.
12/10/1899 DA FERNTREE GULLY played BAYSWATER on the latter's ground on Saturday last (7/10/1899) where the result was a draw – FERNTREE GULLY 7/95, Bayswater 4/55.
22/11/1899 AGE COUNTRY CRICKET; FERNTREE GULLY, Tuesday. BAYSWATER played FERNTREE GULLY on the latter ground on Saturday. Scores — BAYSWATER, 61; FERNTREE GULLY, 59
23/11/1899 DA FERNTREE GULLY played BAYSWATER at Bayswater on Saturday last (18/11/1899) which resulted in a win for BAYSWATER by 3 runs. BAYSWATER made 62 and FERNTREE GULLY were dismissed for 59 (F. Pool taking 8/12).
3/1/1900 SPMAN A little while ago the British public was virtuously indignant because the refugees from Johannesburg having used up all the available stock, were forced, in their anxiety to get away from the doomed city, to actually travel in open trucks Yet, somehow or other, the Australian seems to accommodate him-self with ease to the much inferior method of transport provided by our own railway authorities at holiday times. Scores: - FERNTREE GULLY 241 for 6 wickets, innings declared closed (C. Watson 124 retired, G. Williams 77, C. Morley 31); Traffic Auditors 57 (McGregor 15)
7/2/1900 HER CRICKET, M.C.C. sends a team to Ferntree Gully to play the local club tomorrow, leaving by the 10 a.m. train.
8/2/1900 AGE CRICKET; M.C.C. play FERNTREE GULLY, at the Gully today, leaving by the 10 a.m. train.
10/2/1900 AGE COUNTRY CRICKET, FERNTREE GULLY, Friday, M.C.C. v. FERNTREE GULLY, on the ground of the latter, on Thursday, (8/2/1900) resulted in a win for Melbourne by 53 runs. Scores: — M.C.C., 165; FERNTREE GULLY; 112. M.C.C. Sutherland 42 not out, Davidson 27; McKean 27, Blackham 17; FERNTREE GULLY, C. Watson 32, O.S. Williams 25, C. Morley 25.
