Newspaper Notes

5/8/1910 **AGE** FERNTREE GULLY - The Postal department is now willing tenders for the supply and delivery of telegraph poles for the new trunk line from this district to the metropolis. The new line when finished will pass through Oakleigh and is the most direct route to the city. The shire council has decided to expend some hundreds of pounds in improvements to the local RECREATION GROUND, and in future cricket and football matches will take place on the NEW OVAL.

2/9/1910 **BHR** It was decided that a competition be held during the coming season, and the first reading of the rules was entered upon. It was resolved that the competition should start on Saturday, 1st October, consideration of the matter of dividing the competition into grades being deferred until it was ascertained how many teams would be competing. The following clubs have so far signified their intention of competing: - Canterbury (two teams); Surrey Hills, Box Hill, Blackburn, Ringwood, Mooroolbark, Croydon, Doncaster (two teams), Doncaster Heights, Templestowe (two teams), Koonung, FERNTREE GULLY, Warrandyte, East Burwood, and Mitcham. Entries close on Tuesday, 20th September, when, at a meeting in "The Studio," Box Hill, rules will be finally adopted, office-bearers elected, and a draw made. **NOTE: Despite this suggestion that the Club would enter the Reporter District Cricket Association in 1910/11, this did not eventuate!**

24/2/1911 **HER** T. Table and F. Dunn, for the NORTHCOTE CLUB ELEVEN, put up a good partnership together on Saturday last at Lower Ferntree Gully. The NORTHCOTE CLUB ELEVEN journeyed to Ferntree Gully on Saturday last, and easily defeated the local team. NORTHCOTE had a strong team afield and had first use of the wicket.

They put up a good batting performance, scoring in an hour and a quarter 157 runs for six wickets. Goodyear (34), Cox 27 (retired), Thomas (19), Langton (15), Dunn (16), were NORTHCOTE'S best batsmen, though the nine men who batted all got double figures.

The GULLY'S best bowler was Carrington. He secured the six wickets that fell for 56 runs, and the NORTHCOTE batsmen found him hard to play all day. The FERNTREE GULLY batsmen were all put to the right-about for 60 runs, Cox (18 run out) being their best batsman.
