1924/25	Affiliated with RDCA A Section consisting of 6 teams

1922/23	The Club's Captain, W.H. (William Hamilton) Armstrong passed away post match after collapsing on the final Saturday of the season – He had earlier top scored with 74 in oppressive conditions when the temperature reached over 42 degrees, which undoubtedly contributed to his passing
1921/22	FTGCC affiliated with the second season of the RDCA in Section One , consisting of 5 teams with Section Two having 4 teams, The Pavilion Grandstand was upgraded with a gable roofed section
1920/21	Recommended playing arranged games
1915/16	FTGCC disbanded until 1920/21 due to WW1
1913/14	First affiliated in competition based cricket in the Reporter District Cricket Association (now Box Hill Reporter District Cricket Association)
1912/13	Commenced arranged matches on the new Ferntree Gully Recreation Reserve

PRE COMPETITION INFORMATION

1912	May 25th – formal opening of the Ferntree Gully Recreation Reserve, equipped with the original Pavilion, which was relocated piece by piece across Ferny Creek (before Lysterfield Road – now Brenock Park Drive, was constructed) from behind the Ferntree Gully ‘Middle’ Hotel. The pavilion was extensively renovated and an open viewing Grandstand added to the top of the building
1910/11	“ Ferntree Gully Imperials Cricket Club ” name dropped at 1911 Annual General Meeting
1904/05	“ Ferntree Gully Cricket Club ” renamed “ Ferntree Gully Imperials Cricket Club ”
1899/1900	FTGCC denied affiliation with the Eastern District Trophy Competition run by the Box Hill Reporter newspaper.
1895	October: Current serving President & 1889/90 FTGCC founder – T.S. (Thomas Samuel) Grimwood passed away
1894/95	The ‘ Giffen Business ’ occurs when the Gully’s selected players: George Williams and Ern Blazey refuse to play for the Dandenong XVIII against the touring English Test squad – Captained by A.E. (Andrew Ernest) Stoddart . They withdrew in protest at the non-selection of Ted Lording who had dominated the batting in the area to date that season and then suffered comparisons in the local press to George Giffen who famously withdrew from a previous England Tour because his brother wasn’t selected as well!
1892	Jan 21 & 22 – Five members of the Club were selected in the Malvern XXII to play against the touring English Test squad at the Malvern Cricket Ground. The English team was led on the field by the ‘colossus of cricket’, English cricket immortal: W.G. (William Gilbert) Grace. Accompanying the 1891/92 tour was Lord Sheffield who, in a gesture of extreme good will, donated £150 towards the purchase of the “Sheffield Shield”, which saw the commencement of the major interstate cricket competition in Australia.
1889/90	“ Glenfern Cricket Team ” renamed Ferntree Gully Cricket Club by Tom Grimwood, with the entity that commenced in 1882/83 having ceased to operate in the mid 1880’s
1885/86	“ Glenfern Cricket Team ” formed by Tom Grimwood, Licensee ‘FTG Hotel’ – October 1885.
1882/83	A team called Ferntree Gully represents the District in a cricket match, though this is known to be more of a nominal, rather than official title as the team was a hybrid of members from the first generation of the Scoresby Cricket Club augmented by members drawn from within the Ferntree Gully district
1877/78	First recorded cricket match in Ferntree Gully
1877	First Test Match – March 1877 at MCG between Australia and England
1867	December 31 st – The Intercolonial cricketers from New South Wales were invited by their Victorian counterparts to a picnic at Ferntree Gully on New Year’s Eve, after their four day match concluded on the 30 th of December. Among those known to have been in the party were T.W. (Thomas ‘Tom’ Wentworth) Wills, John (‘Jack’) Conway, R.W. (Richard Wilson) Wardill, Samuel (‘Sam’) Cosstick and F.E. (Frank Erskine) Allan . All were well known for their cricketing exploits prior to Test match cricket’s commencement and this picnic report is the earliest known mention of cricket/cricketers in Ferntree Gully.
